

Joel M. Silberberg M.D. is currently Medical Director, Envolve Health, Centene Corporation. He also maintains a private practice of psychiatry and forensic psychiatry. Dr. Silberberg graduated from the University of the Witwatersrand, South Africa and is Board Certified in general and forensic psychiatry. He has experience in general and forensic psychiatry including violence risk assessment and reduction, and in public psychiatry as the Medical Director of Madden Mental Health Center (1994-1998) and Director of Mental Health Services at Cermak Health Services of Cook County, Chicago, Illinois (1998-2002), the healthcare provider for the Cook County Department of Corrections. He is a Physician Surveyor for the National Commission on Correctional Healthcare, a Board Member of The Academy of Correctional Health Professionals (ACHP) and Vice Chair of the Education Committee of ACHP. He currently serves on the Education and Program Committees of the American Academy of Psychiatry and the Law (AAPL). He has teaching experience as Professor of Psychiatry and Director of Medical Student Education in Psychiatry at Loyola University of Chicago and as Program Director, Fellowship in Forensic Psychiatry at the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio. From 2006 until 2011 he was Director, Division of Forensic Psychiatry at Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine where he obtained accreditation from The Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) for the only Forensic Psychiatry Fellowship Training Program in Illinois. From 2012 until 2016 he was a Professor of Psychiatry at University of Nevada School of Medicine. From 2016 until 2018 he was Professor, Director of the Division of Forensic Psychiatry, Program Director of the Forensic Psychiatry Fellowship Training Program and Director of Telepsychiatry at the University of Florida College of Medicine, Gainesville. He was an attending physician at UF Health Shands Psychiatric Hospital and a supervisor of residents and medical students. Dr. Silberberg's forensic expertise includes criminal issues such as competence to proceed, sanity, diminished capacity, and mitigation, and civil issues such as emotional harm, workers compensation and workplace violence. He has significant expertise in corrections in regard to issues of civil rights violations, suicide and wrongful death.
