## PYC Inter Club Competition 2005

### Report from Denise Rosenfeldt, PYC Interclub Convener

This year there were eight entries from Ashhurst, Hutt Valley and City of Sales junior stamp clubs. The entries were judged by Tim Beach, Barbara Streeter and myself. There was only one traditional entry, this reflects the overall trend away from children to collect New Zealand stamps. It is sad that our young collectors lack the knowledge of New Zealand stamps and general knowledge about philately that accompanies it.

The seven thematic entries varied in standard, the higher scoring entries showing a good introduction, plan, and development of their thematic story. The

most common mistake was the exhibit not following the intent in the introductory statement.

Jason Longstaff of the Ashhurst Junior Stamp Club submitted the best thematic entry, and the traditional entry was from Dimitri Viatos of the Hutt Valley Junior Club.

We are pleased to award the trophy for 2005 to the Ashhurst Club.


# Stamp Camp 2006 - News Release

Many years ago a 16 year old stamp collector, Rob Hunt, after attending a school music camp had an idea.

This idea was to have a camp for his favourite hobby, thus in 1966 the first stamp camp was held. The first camp was held in Spencerville near Christchurch. Every year since at least one stamp camp has been held somewhere around New Zealand, with many well known philatelist having attended.

2006 is the 40th anniversary of the first camp and this year's camp is going to be special.

## MOTU MOANA

The Motu Moana Scout Camp is situated in Connaught St, Green Bay, Auckland. Stamp Camp 2003 will use the Puketane accommodation block, which consists of 12 bunkrooms sleeping 2 - 6 persons, toilets and showers, kitchen and dining hall as well as the Whare Takarangi for meetings and stamp collecting work. Situated within the grounds are playing fields, trampolines, campfire circles, a chapel and Challenge Valley. Supervised access will be made available to this facility.

The camp programme will include all the usual aspects to camp, with another great opportunity to meet other collectors from around the country and make new friends.

## CAMP ACTIVITIES

We are also planning to commemorate this special year with a number of activities including inviting past campers and supporters back to catch up with those who have attended camps in the last 40 years. A history of the camps is also being produced to capture moments from all those great times had at previous camps.

A camp application form has been included with this issue of Fun Philately so if you are interested in attending complete the form and send it away. Places will be limited as camps in Auckland are always popular so we recommend early enrolment. Campers will be met at the airport, bus stations and other transport hubs if you are travelling from out of town. Some sponsorship money maybe available to assist with the costs if you are a member of a junior stamp club, discuss this with your club leaders.
