Reports:

- Principal Dietchman presented the Elementary and Middle School Students of the Month for the trait of "Ownership". He also provided an update on school enrollment and shared that girls' basketball and boys' wrestling have begun in Upton Middle School, Mr. Dietchman informed the board on the monthly academic and classroom highlights from both schools, as well as updates on Bobcat Adventures. Upcoming events for the Elementary and Middle School include The Thanksgiving
- Blessing and the Elementary and Middle School food drive.
 Principal Samuelson presented the High School Student of the Month for the trait of "Ownership". He also updated the board on the New Orleans symposium, where Upton High School had the opportunity to present what personalized learning looks like in our school. Mr. Samuelson also provided updates on sports activities and plans to send a pep bus to Casper for the first volleyball game at the state tournament. He informed the board that the football co-op with Sundance in football is ending and the school will be transitioning to Upton Bobcat 9-man football. F-Clubs have been active this week, with all three joining together to run a food drive for the local food bank. He also reported that the FFA chapter traveled to National FFA Convention in Indianapolis, earned a Three Star Chapter rating, and that Josalyn Pischke placed 3rd in the nation with her Agriscience Fair project on equine cold therapy.

 Dr. Coberly recognized Josalyn Pischke for her achievement at the National FFA Convention. He updated the board on maintenance
- projects across the district and the pool feasibility study, and noted he will be looking for volunteers for a steering committee. He also shared that the Upton Economic Development Board is funding the feasibility study. Dr. Coberly reported that the annual audit is not ready for presentation due to the government shutdown and is expected to be ready for the December board meeting. Discussion was held to move the December board meeting and legislative dinner to December 3rd, 2025, and Dr. Coberly informed the board that the staff Christmas breakfast would be held on December 5th. He updated the board on the upcoming consolidated grant audit, professional development days in both buildings, and highlighted the work of building principals and
 - staff. on what we do as a district. Frankie Medlen presented the Technology Report, noting CIPA compliance, which makes us eligible for E-Rate discounts. She reviewed the district's Internet Safety Policy, and gave an overview of the school's online monitor and internet safety programs used in the schools
