pastor's letter

from pastor jane

Dear Friends in Christ,

Last week, I was notified that one of my first acts would be a baptism. What a wonderful way to begin ordained ministry! The Taylor Carlson family met with me after work, where we discussed the baptism of Cora Fern. What a joy to hold a tiny baby again! Both parents' faith has been nurtured by Hope's faith community in their youth and it is their desire to provide that same nurturing for their daughter. No greater praise could be offered to the ministry of those who have preceded me, in pastoral care and youth ministry.

It is my desire to water the seeds of faith planted with teaching the Word and with sacrament. As we live out the promises of our baptismal covenant together, it is my prayer for each of you that God will guide me to be the best shepherd I can be to you, in His service. During that time your prayers, guidance, and wisdom are greatly appreciated.

Helpful examples of transition are Biblically described in:

Joshua 1-5: Joshua is faithful to God in leadership passed on by Moses.

Acts 9:3-6, 20, 13:9-10: Saul, the murderous persecutor transitions to Paul, the apostle.

Acts 2:2-4, 14, 38-39: The disciples are changed and sent forth in ministry.

Thank you for the opportunity of serving you, as you seek God's will in finding the best pastor for Hope Lutheran Church. As a trained, certified, and ordained pastor in Interim Ministry, I am called to deal with the dynamic changes that may occur when a beloved pastor, such as Pastor Paul, retires after 25 years of care and service. Your Transition Team has already implemented the self-study tool that was chosen as the best fit for Hope Lutheran. You are fortunate to have a dedicated lay leadership which is a sign of a strong and healthy church family.

On a personal note, it will be difficult for my husband Dr. Steve Ekholm and I to be separated, but we have been doing this now (off and on) for four years while I was a seminary student. We hope to be together from Sunday afternoons to Monday nights or early Tuesday mornings, depending on weather, and barring emergencies in the parish, of course. 

A New Start

The soloist began to sing a special song during the worship service. It was awful! She had somehow started on the wrong note, terribly out of tune with the accompanist. She abruptly stopped and announced she needed a new start. She then began anew with a beautiful addition to the morning worship. Had she tried to limp through the first try, people would have remembered the off-key solo. Instead, by her second start, the congregation was assisted in their worship of the Lord.

That is the way it is with our lives, too. Our first start in life, our birth, is awful because of sin. We are born with a sin condition that makes it impossible for us to please God no matter how hard we try. We are captive to disobedience of God and His Law, to "doing it our way" and the passions of sin. But unlike the soloist we cannot even recognize we are out of tune with God.

Then it is God Who comes to us by His Word to show us our sin. It is He Who offers us grace and forgiveness through faith in Jesus Christ. It is He Who by His Holy Spirit gives us that new start through Baptism. Through Baptism, we are united to Christ. Because Christ died for our sins, we are baptized into the death of sin with Him, that we may be raised to new life with Him.

The Apostle Paul tells us, "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold the new has come." (2 Corinthians 5:17). God has redeemed and restored us into new people who live under the Lordship of Christ. We are given new hearts and a new nature. Through faith that God gives us, we live in Christ and for Him, and through faith, we serve Christ by serving others.

Now our lives can be pleasing to God, like the soloist's second start. Not because of our work, but because of the power of God's gracious gift to us, Holy Baptism.

Witnesses for Christ

The story is told of a young man who had been out of work for some time. Jobs were scarce, but he was at last offered a job for the summer in a logging camp up north. His parents were somewhat concerned about the reaction of the rest of the crew when they found out the young man was a Christian. If the image of a lumberjack was true, they were sure his life would be quite unbearable. Upon his return home in the fall, his mother immediately inquired as to what had taken place when the word got out that he was a Christian, to which he replied, "They didn't find out!"

Most of us don't find ourselves in logging camps, but do those around us, wherever we are, know we are Christians? Are they aware that we are God's children? Does what come out of our mouths ever leave any doubt as to who is in control of our lives? Jesus said, "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be My witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth" (Acts 1:8). We are called to witness so we need to answer the question if we will be a good witness or a poor one. When Jesus' disciples were told to stop preaching the Good News, they said, "For we cannot but speak of what we have seen and heard" (Acts 4:20).

So, how about us? God blessed us with minds and mouths to speak. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, God will give us the words and the courage to use them. Let's be aware of the opportunities He places before us and make sure that the whole world hears the Good News. Make up your mind, right now, to become a joy-filled witness of God's love and forgiveness for all people.
