## Jones likes undefeated feeling

Now that his Coyotes are 3-0, Kansas Wesleyan basketball coach Jerry Jones might wish they didn't have to wait two weeks until their next game—Nov. 22 at Baker.

"Now that we're 3-0, sure," Jones said Sunday, the day after KW won its third game in as many nights, 81-71 over Bartlesville (Okla.) Wesleyan, in the final game of the Burger King-Kangaroo Classic basketball tournament at Muir Gymnasium.

"But on the other hand, he observed, "We know we're going to be undefeated almost the entire month of November."

The Baker contest is the only date left on the Coyotes' November schedule. After that game, KW will return home to open its Kansas Conference slate Dec. 4 against Southwestern.

As in their first two victories, the Coyotes turned to their bench and their defense in the second half Saturday night against the Eagles.

"We used all of our players, and they all got quite a bit of playing time. That keeps everybody fresh and wears down the other team," Jones said.

The Coyotes dealt Bartlesville a deadly blow early in the second half. Ahead only 38-36 at halftime, the Coyotes trailed 43-42 four minutes

## Phillips fires Saints player during ball game

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — New Orleans Saints Coach Bum Phillips kicked nose tackle Tony Elliott off the team midway through Sunday's National Football League loss to Seattle, one of Elliott's defensive teammates said after the game.

The dismissal was made known after Phillips finished his postgame press conference, and the coach was not available for followup comment. Elliott was not at his locker after the game.

Linebacker Rickey Jackson told reporters that Phillips pulled Elliott out of the game and criticized him for failing to use the proper technique in rushing Seattle quarterback Dave Krieg.

Elliott responded that he was tired of being chop blocked, Jackson said, and Phillips told him he would never again play for New Orleans.

A chop block is a block delivered at or below the knees.

## Sixers trim Bucks, 105-97

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Rookie Terry Catledge used a shot he perfected on the playground to help the Philadelphia 76ers to a 105-97 National Basketball Association victory Sunday night over the Milwaukee Bucks.

Catledge, who went in after Charles Barkley got into foul trouble in the third quarter, picked up 10 points — eight of them in a key, fourth-quarter Sixers surge — and had three turnaround jumpers.

"I have a lot of confidence in my turnaround. It's been my best shot since high school," said Catledge, the Sixers' No. 1 draft choice.

"I felt very comfortable out there tonight," said Catledge. "I like being the first sub off the bench. It gives me a lot of confidence."

Philadelphia led 77-75 going into the fourth quarter and then went on a 13-4 spurt to take a 90-79 lead. Catledge scored eight points in the surge, which was capped by a driving layup by Julius Erving with 6:13 to play.

Milwaukee pulled to within 100-97 on a rebound basket by Sidney Moncrief with 38 seconds to play, but Philadelphia's Sedale Threatt made two free throws with 34 seconds left to seal the victory.

Moses Malone piled up 25 points and 12 rebounds in the first half and finished with 35 points and 14 rebounds.

"That was obviously a big win for us, especially against a team of that quality," said Sixers Coach Matt Guokas. "We played real good defense and Moses came out with fire in his eyes."

Philadelphia had built 10-point leads twice in the first half, and held a 54-44 lead at intermission.

Milwaukee forward Terry Cummings fouled out late in the game after scoring 6 points, the first time in his career that he had scored less than 10 points in a game, a streak covering 239 contests.

"Terry Cummings is in a slump; that certainly is no secret," said Milwaukee Coach Don Nelson. "I am trying to let him just play his way out of it. We had a good talk before the game and I think it's just going to be a matter of time before he gets back on track."
