



"Save the Wave"

Do you know about the "wave"? If not, then probably you bought your first Corvette after 1996, and it was probably a C5, C6 or C7. Most Corvette owners prior to 1996 are familiar with the wave and very adept at handling this 66 year old tradition.

From the time Corvette # 001 rolled off the assembly line, Corvette owners became a breed of their own. It was so unusual to see another Corvette on the road in the early years that Corvette drivers found they had to acknowledge each other when they met and they created the Corvette "salute". This is an unspoken "honour" to the Corvette.


This salute is very distinct. When another Corvette approaches you on the road, your right hand, without removing it from the steering wheel, raises the index and middle finger immediately before passing the on-coming Corvette. It makes no difference what year or model it is – you salute it and the driver will salute you back – usually at exactly the same time. If you pull up beside another Corvette, you salute him in the same way but by the outside hand – left lane – left hand, right lane – right hand.

The Corvette "salute" is now known as the "Corvette Wave".

The term "Save the Wave" became popular after the production of the first C5s. The straight axel, mid-year, C3 and C4 owners never thought the "wave" might become extinct but, the newer Corvette owners ignored acknowledging the older Corvettes on the road. This started a movement where seasoned and passionate Corvette owners started signing their names on personal documents followed by the tag line – "Save the Wave". It is now on bumper stickers, refrigerator magnets, event programmes, cakes – it is put on everything to get it out there and educate the "newer" Corvette owners.

So, when you approach another Corvette on the road, try the wave – the driver will most likely respond and it's a warm, fuzzy feeling.

Joe Spielman became the proud owner of his first Corvette as a 19-year old university engineering student and, except for a sixmonth period, maintained a collection of Corvettes for 37 years, owning 33 Corvettes. As a GM vice president and general manager of Manufacturing, Spielman was a member of the team that moved the fifth generation Corvette (C5), along with the revolutionary

GIBSON HUFSTADER

Gibson (Gib) Hufstader had an honourable career with Corvette over 45 years, involving him with the Grand Sport, AeroVette, Twin Turbo LT5 and many other facets of Corvette. He began his GM career in the 50's as a development engineer for Chevrolet R & D. In 1960 Hufstader also worked with Zora Duntov as a design release engineer for

James "Jim" Jeffords was a two-time National Driving Champion, recognized for his exciting racing mark in legendary race cars and automobiles. Jeffords maintained a racing career that began over 50 years ago, appearing in the very first Road America race at Elkhart Lake in September 1955. Early success earned him his first ride in a

Corvette in May of 1956. Jim began 1957 at Sebring, Florida as a driver on the Chevrolet Corvette Racing Team and was later invited to help form a Corvette race team for a Chicago-based dealership. Read more about Jim Jeffords at



The 2019 season for Corvette Racing concluded with the 4-day October 9-12 Petit Le Mans race at Road Atlanta near Braselton GA. It's really unfortunate that our team didn't have a better race, even though the overall hope was to end the C7.R era with a victory. The No. 3 car took a fourth place finish while the No. 4 Corvette ended in 7th place. The team struggled with tire grip throughout the first part of the race; even extra pit stops to change tire compounds inside a full five hours of green-flag racing didn't help. At least the weather was decent!

At race end, Antonio Garcia and Jan Magnussen tied for second in GTLM drivers' points; Chevrolet are third in Manufactures' points.

Petit Le Mans marked Jan Magnussen's final race with Corvette. It was announced before Petit that, after 16 years, 156 race starts, 35 wins and four championships with Corvette, Jan would be seeking racing opportunities elsewhere in 2020...a **huge** disappointment to his fans! Jan joined Corvette Racing in 2004 as an endurance driver and became a full-time driver in 2007, partnering with Antonio Garcia in 2012.

Filling big shoes will be Jordan Taylor, no stranger to Corvette Racing fans. Jordan will leave WTR (Wayne Taylor Racing – his father's team) to drive the new C8.8 mid-engine race car. The first race of the 2020 season will be the Rolex 24 at Daytona on January 25-26. We wish them a very successful season!!

THE CORVETTE C8.R RACE CAR IS CONFIRMED FOR 2020

Corvette Racing has more than 60 years of racing heritage and a very important debut in Corvette racing history came in early October. The C8 mid-engine was revealed in July but the first mid-engine GT Le Mans (GTLM) race car for Corvette made its debut alongside the 2020 Stingray convertible in Florida at the Kennedy Space Center on October 2nd.



Corvette Racing has enjoyed tremendous success on the track in the last 20 years, winning 107 races – the most of any professional sports car team in North America. Those included 13 team championships and 12 Driver and Manufacturer titles. In 2015, Corvette Racing became the first sports car team in 15 years to win endurance racing's

Triple Crown - victories at Rolex 24 At Daytona, Mobil 1 Twelve Hours of Sebring and 24 Hours of Le Mans - in the same season!

The C8.R No. 4 car wear a new livery of silver with yellow accents. The No. 3 car will feature a traditional yellow colour scheme with silver accents that continues the colour scheme of the successful GTLM racing Corvettes of the past 20 years.

The C8.R will make its racing debut at Rolex 24 At Daytona on the weekend of Jan. 23-26, 2020.
