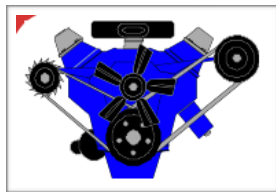

2017 Rocky Mountain Mustang Roundup

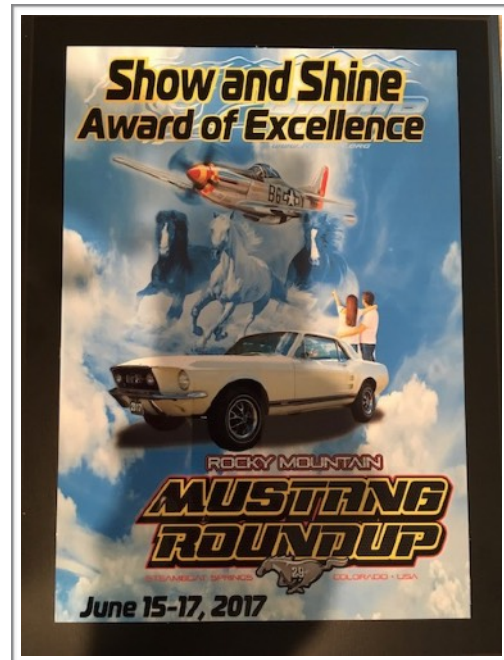

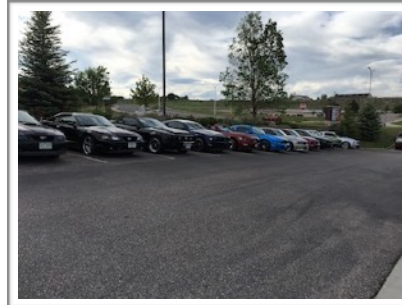

My Pride and Joy on 4 Wheels ... Dick Bisbee

I wanted to share with you my first Mustang. It was a cool morning with a light snow falling in North Attleborough, Massachusetts. I got a ride to the car dealer, ready to sign away, so I could make payments for the next few years. The Time was now and the salesman was walking towards me, hand out, ready to shake my hand. He had a huge smile on his face, probably thinking about his cut of the sale.

My thoughts were on driving the Mustang, and I wanted to get the paperwork finished so I could get behind the wheel. I must have signed my name at least 100 times; at least it felt like I did. Finally it was over. The salesman handed me the keys, and I was on my way to my Mustang.

I opened the door and looked in, I was sure it would never be that clean again. My heart was racing, just like I was going out on a first date with the best looking girl in school. My mouth was dry and my hands sweaty, lucky for me this was not a date, as I don't think I could have spoken a word. Wiping my hands on my jeans, I slid into the cockpit of my Mustang. I just sat there looking around at every nook and cranny taking a mental picture of everything. The seat felt cool, it was February 23, and a light snow was falling. The seat fit like no other I had sat in, it was mine, and I would be sitting there many times in the future. I inserted the key, put my left foot on the clutch pedal and pushed it to the floor, and turned the key. The car rumbled to life, like an approaching thunderstorm. I pressed my right foot on the accelerator pedal the rumble turned into a growl.

The time had come to drive the Mustang off the dealer's lot. I eased the clutch out and gave some pressure to the accelerator. Turning on the radio, Steppenwolf was playing "Born To Be Wild". I felt a tear building up in my eye as the Mustang pulled out on to the highway. My wish, hope, and dreams had all come true. I had wanted a Mustang for 20 plus years, and had been saving for half that time. This big moment in my life, one of those you never forget.

As I drove down the highway, I wondered why I had waited so long to pull the pin and purchase a Mustang. You see, this was not my first Mustang. It was however, my first NEW right off the Ford dealer floor with four miles on it, Mustang.

At that time I was 56 years old; I had previously owned a 1965 2+2 Fastback from 1968-1971 that I traded in for a 1967 Mach 1 Mustang in 1971. I later traded the Mach 1 in for a car that will go unmentioned in 1973 (hint-not a Mustang). I wished I never traded in the Mach 1, almost immediately. I wanted another Mustang from that point forward.

Finally 32 years later, my dream came true...Again. I opened my local Mustang Car Club magazine, *Mustang Car Club of New England*, just like I did every time it arrived in the mail, and began to skim through it. This time however, I noticed on the back page a coupon for \$950.00 off the sticker price of any new 2004 Mustang GT on Rodman Ford's lot in Foxboro, Massachusetts; it was just what I was dreaming about.

When I arrived at Rodman Ford, my only decision was what color I wanted, and that was easy, black just like my first two Mustangs. I picked out one of the remaining black Mustang GTs with a 5 speed.

Since that cold day, February 23, 2005, I have been babying my Mustang, it only has 13,500 miles on it as of 2017. I have however put gold stripes on it similar to the 1966 Hertz GT 350 H cars. When not driving I keep it in a garage and hooked to a Battery Tender® and even after 13 years it still has the original battery, as well as the original tires.

Club Clothing

There are two sources of club clothing: Graffi-T's Screen Printing and More, and Lands' End. Graffi-Ts is located in the Springs and provides silkscreened clothing. Lands' End is available online and provides their clothing embroidered with the club's logo.

Graffi-Ts

Graffi-T will provide club clothing that includes the Mustangers logo on the left chest and the running horses across the back. The long sleeve garments also include a left and right sleeve print. The colors that work best with our logos are: white, light grays, light blues, pinks, light greens, yellows, red, tans, and orange. The available styles are: sweatshirts, hoodies, long sleeve t-shirts, short sleeve t-shirts, and ladies v-neck t-shirts. A minimum order of 24 or more pieces in mixed styles, colors and sizes is required. In order to meet the minimum order quantity, the club accumulates individual member requests until the minimum quantity is met, then places an order. There are shirts available from previous club orders. Please contact Bryan Lowry about clothing currently in the club's shirt inventory.

Rocky Mountain Mustangers stitched-logo apparel is available from Lands' End. Use this link [Lands' End](#) to access the club's Lands' End website to place an order. The logo is shown below. Clothing items include shirts, sweaters, blazers, jackets, and caps.:



The cost of an item is the cost to apply the logo to the item you select (\$8.50) plus the cost of the item itself, and shipping (typically \$9.95 for multiple items). There is no minimum quantity; orders may be placed for single items. The time from placing the order to receiving it is typically three weeks.


