

**Evangelism:** In the area of evangelism, the ministerial team which is made up of four members including myself has done so much. ## **Challenges:**

- 1. Mobility- Mobility is one of the greatest challenges that we face at the center. It is very crucial that we visit the homes of our students to ensure their success. This is very difficult because some families live 4 to 5 miles away from the Mission Center. Also, we must transport our medical team and its resources to other communities. We are in need of transportation to better carry out our work.
- 2. We need religious instructional materials for the kids like Bibles, Story books and Hymn Books.
