Ash Tree Removal To Hit Southwestern Hills Neighborhood





The Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) is headed to Des Moines with destruction of the Ash tree in its path. If you travel in our neighborhood you see many Ash trees with painted red dots on the trunk. David Jahn, Municipal Arborist for Des Moines and resident of the neighborhood prepared a question and answer sheet that may help.

SW Hills Q&A regarding EAB and ash tree removal/treatment 09-17-14

What do the red paint dots mean on ash trees in SW Hills Neighborhood? <u>Answer</u>: Red dot trees are to be removed within the next three years, exact schedule for SW Hills unknown. Enjoy your trees while they are still there. After removal the city will give opportunity to receive a new tree planting(s) on the curb at no cost to the adjacent property owner.

How were removals determined? Can residents inquire about saving a tree?

Answer: Any tree scheduled for removal and marked with the red paint dot is so identified because it has some health or structure issue that prevents it from being a treatment candidate. Some typical causes are cavity, co-dominant trunks, mechanical damage, and canopy dieback among others. Some trees have multiple problems. When trees were assessed, adjacent property owners were provided with a flyer indicating pending removal within the next 3 years, and noting the reason(s) why it was being removed. The city will not permit treatment of trees the city considers to be compromised in either health or structure. Any citizen who does not understand why the tree(s) adjacent to their property will be removed, may contact City Forestry to make inquiry. They may call 283-4583.

What do the aluminum tags mean?

<u>Answer</u>: Ash trees with a numbered aluminum tag attached to the trunk are scheduled to be treated in the Spring of 2015, if EAB has been discovered in the city by that time. The treatment is viable for 2 years, with subsequent treatments scheduled at 2-year intervals through 2019. Treatment will be conducted by the city at no cost to the adjacent property owner.

If the city has designated an ash tree for removal, may the adjacent property owner seek a permit to treat it?

<u>Answer</u>: If the tree is an ash and the city has determined it is not a treatment candidate, residents may not treat this tree for the reasons stated earlier.

Des Moines Pubic Schools Offers Another Program With Opportunities

Mercy Medical Center, Des Moines Public Schools, Easter Seals Iowa and Iowa Vocational Rehabilitation Services have partnered together to bring Project SEARCH to the Des Moines area. This collaborative effort was initiated in the fall of 2012 and currently involves twelve students who are interning at Mercy Medical Center in Des Moines. These students are being provided a range of hands-on job experiences and developing work skills necessary for future employment. Mercy Medical Center Project SEARCH offers Des Moines Public School students with disabilities (18-21 years old), that have completed their graduation requirements, a one-year school-to-work program that takes place entirely at Mercy Medical Center. Total workplace immersion facilitates, a seamless combination of classroom instruction, career exploration, and relevant job-skills training obtained through a variety of strategically designed internships.

The national Project SEARCH program began in 1996 by Erin Reihle, Director of the Emergency Department at Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center. She had a number of entry level positions to fill and worked with the Great Oaks Career Campuses and the Hamilton County Board of Developmental Disability Services to provide an opportunity for students with disabilities to participate in the workplace.

The program was so successful that the model was adopted in 40 states and four countries including the National Institute of Health – Clinical Center, Xavier University, the Federal Department of Labor, and the University of Rochester Medical Center.

Heather Carman, the instructor of the program stated, "Project SEARCH allows students to find their areas of interest and gain the skills necessary to obtain and maintain employment in those fields." She added, "Project SEARCH is not only beneficial for the students, but it is also beneficial to Mercy and the community as a whole. It is definitely a win-win for everyone. This program produces quality candidates for employment in numerous areas." Out of twenty-four students that have completed the program, twenty-one of them are employed in the field of their interest. The Project SEARCH model is a proven recipe for success.
