Florida Laws for Motorcycle Passengers

EWMA recently updated the original co-rider safety presentation and renamed it "Riding Two-Up." Judging from the chapters and ride-ins I have attended, I would venture to say that a significant portion of EWMA riding on our larger touring motorcycles is two-up.

In the EWMA safety presentations and group ride pre-briefings involving co-riders, we mostly focus on teamwork, hand signals, and safety considerations for the co-rider. So, in this article, I'm taking a slightly different tact by focusing on the Florida <u>motorcycle laws</u> that apply to the "passenger." My references were:

The 2023 Florida Statutes (including Special Session C)

316.208 Motorcycles and mopeds.

316.2085 Riding on motorcycles or mopeds.

316.209 Operating motorcycles on roadways laned for traffic.

316.2095 Footrests, handholds, and handlebars.

316.211 Equipment for motorcycle and moped riders.

To constrain this article to our general, 2-up situation, my use of the term "motorcycle" refers to Honda Goldwing and Can-Am Spyder classes of motorcycles designed and equipped for a single, rear passenger. The term "passenger" refers to an adult, over 21 years of age. Even though an EWMA "corider" differs significantly from a "passenger" in terms of their contributions to safety and teamwork, in legal and EWMA terms, a co-rider is a passenger and the rider is the operator.

Here are some simple questions for the reader to review. selfevaluate, and perhaps improve their knowledge of the laws about motorcycle passengers as defined above. Please note, if the above constraints are different for your riding situation, then the answers will likely change.

1. Are motorcycle passengers required by Florida law to wear an approved <u>helmet</u> (protective headgear) while riding a motorcycle? Yes, in Florida, helmets are required for operators and passengers UNLESS covered by an insurance policy providing for at least \$10,000 or greater for injuries incurred as a result of a crash while riding on a motorcycle. This type insurance is called medical payments coverage. The holder of this example motorcycle insurance card issued to a motorcycle operator or passenger in Florida is required to wear a helmet.

2. If a helmet is required, must it be securely buckled?

Yes, no exceptions.

3. Are motorcycle passengers required by Florida law to wear approved <u>eye-protective</u> <u>devices</u> while riding a motorcycle? After all, the passenger is <u>behind</u> the operator.

Yes, no exceptions.

4. According to Florida law, does the motorcycle <u>windshield</u> (of any height) qualify as an "eye protection device" for a motorcycle passenger?

No. Eye protection devices must be worn by motorcycle

 passengers in Florida, even if the motorcycle has a windshield. Acceptable options include face shields, goggles, and eyeglasses (including sunglasses), as long as the eyewear is shatterproof, optically clear, and does not impair vision. 5. Are motorcycle passengers required by Florida law to wear an approved electronic communication device for operator-passenger communication while riding a motorcycle? 	 No, but is it a good idea? Yes, due to wind and traffic noise disrupting important safety communications between rider and passenger? 6. Are motorcycle passengers required by Florida law to wear ATGATT (All The Gear All The Time) helmet, eye protection, full-fingered gloves, long sleeve shirts, long pants, and over-theankle boots? No, but is it a good idea? Yes, to eliminate or reduce the severity of personal injuries in 	case of a stopped drop or slow speed fall or crash at any speed. Please note, the ATGATT code effectiveness decreases as speed increases. Finally, all the passenger laws and recommendations above apply to the motorcycle operator as well! Ride Safe! Friends for FUN, Safety & Riding.

Parents' Day
