Apprenticeship Program Collaboration between ApprenticeshipNC & the Beaufort County Community College

The shared mission of ApprenticeshipNC and the Beaufort County Community College (BCCC) is to ensure Beaufort County has an innovative, relevant, effective and efficient workforce development system that develops adaptable, work-ready, skilled talent to meet the current and future needs of workers and businesses to achieve and sustain economic prosperity.

There are many types of apprenticeship programs of various duration, level of required technical education and level of employer investment. Depending on their design, these programs may be more attractive to specific demographics, including an employer's existing workforce, veterans, high school or college students.

Businesses of all sizes ranging from family-owned to multinational corporations, are investing in apprenticeship programs. An important consideration when planning an apprenticeship program is that apprenticeships require veteran workers to mentor novice apprentices. In addition, an apprenticeship program requires investment; the training and education of a single apprentice can cost upwards of \$100,000. ApprenticeshipNC and the BCCC can help lower costs and increase an employer's return on investment using state grants and governmental codes.

The duration of an apprenticeship program is tied to the technical level of the duties, but all apprenticeships will see a return on investment to the employer and the employee.
