Regular Meeting -----February 16, 1988

The meeting was called to order by the Vice-Chairman, Gary Wilson at 7:00 A.M. Other Grand County Water Conservancy District members present were Dutch Zimmerman, John Smith, Jim Walker and John Groo.

ATTENDANCE

Grand County Special Service District members present were Gary Wilson, George White and Bill McDougald.

Others present were Kim Robertson, Dale Pierson and Roberta Highland.

Roberta read the minutes of the meeting of February 2, 1988. After calling for additions and corrections and hearing none, the Chair declared the minutes approved as read.

MINUTES

Kim reported that after a study of culinary water to the Old City Park, a 6" line would deprive Highland Hills of their water pressure. A 4" line would restrict delivery to the City of Moab only. He feels the Board idea of putting the line in the same trench as a sewer line would be desirable. After a question, Dale reported he feels the District would be better off letting people in the new development could irrigate with culinary water. The District needs the revenue of selling culinary over irrigation water. The plans for water and sewer to the new proposed development was discussed. The Board agreed by consensus to wait to see if and when the sewer is going to be laid, and install a 4" line in the same trench with a sewer.

WATER LINE TO  
OLD CITY PARK

Gary asked the Board's feeling about renting the empty space RWAU will leave vacant on March 18, 1988. After a brief discussion, the Board agreed not to rent the space.

EMPTY OFFICE

Gary asked the Board about new telephones. Jim moved the District upgrade the telephone system to touchtone phones. Dutch seconded. MOTION CARRIED.



The County will buy the chemicals with their order, and we can get Ted Tibbetts to help spray. Gary thinks that the cost will be about \$800.00. Dale reported the State Engineers concern is with the larger growth on the outside of the dam, extending deep roots, and rodents burrowing in the area, and possibly weakening the dam. George moved to go ahead and order the chemicals. Jim seconded. MOTION CARRIED.
