## 2019 Chinese American Citizens Alliance National Essay Competition for all 9th to 12th grade students

The Chinese American Citizens Alliance of Greater New York (CACAGNY) invites any student enrolled in 9th to 12th grades to participate in the 2019 Chinese American Citizens Alliance National Essay Competition.

This annual essay writing contest, sponsored by the Chinese American Citizens Alliance for over 40 years, has encouraged generations of students to think creatively and write about current issues regarding Chinese Americans. This year's contest will be held on **Saturday, March 2, 2019** at various locations nationwide. The students write on the topic given at the start of the contest for 90 minutes (if on a laptop, no internet allowed) or 2 hours (if by hand writing). The national scholarship awards include \$1,000 for the first prize. CACAGNY will make additional awards to participants from the Greater New York area. There is no fee to participate. - This annual contest is open to any student enrolled in high school (grades 9-12). No entry fee required.
- Participants are given either 90 minutes (laptop users) or 2 hours (Blue Book users) to compose an essay in English not to exceed 500 words on a contemporary topic concerning the Chinese and Asian American communities.
- Each essay will be judged on the basis of originality, clarity of thought and expression.
- National Scholarship Awards: First Prize: \$1,000; Second Prize: \$700; Third Prize: \$500; 10 Awards of Merit: \$100. Greater New York awards to be announced.
