Present Continuous Tense

e.g.

I am playing

You are playing

He is playing.

She is playing.

It is playing.

We are playing.

They are playing.

have / has

e.g.

I have a ball.

You have a ball.

He has a ball.

She has a ball.

It has a ball.

We have a ball.

They have a ball

Question Forms

Who am/are/is/ ?

Is / Are + SUBJECT + VERB + ing?

Do / Does + SUBJECT + have... ?

What + VERB to be + SUBJECT + **doing?**

Phonic Emphasis

/ot/ e.g. It is **not** hot.

/oo/ e.g. **Look** at the **book**.

/all/ e.g. **All** the **balls** are **small**.

/at/ e.g. Look at **Pat** and the **cat**.

/ee/ e.g. The children can **see** a tree.

Gerunds (Nouns made from verbs)

e.g. Pat is good at **reading**. She is good at **writing**, too.

Contractions

It's = It is

... **aren't they?** = ... are they not? (tag question)

Expressions

Yes, please.

Here you are.

Excuse me!

Go on!


