





Kingdomtide

Kingdomtide begins on the last Sunday in August and continues until the beginning of Advent. The emphasis includes evangelism, world missions, and the work for peace and justice in all relationships. During this period, special emphasis is placed on the Kingship of the Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. The observance is wrapped up in the heightened awareness of one of the basic tenets of the Christian faith – the hope of the coming of the Kingdom of Heaven

Color: Green is symbolic of freshness of nature, hope, life and growth.

Advent

Advent is the season of expectation, hope and celebration of the past, present, and future comings of Jesus Christ to the world. Much of the focus is on the prophecy of the coming of the Messiah to Israel and the expectancy of that fulfillment. The Advent cry is "Come," even though Emmanuel has come. Jesus has come, presently comes into the hearts of believers through grace, and is yet to return. This season is a time of anticipation as the Church makes ready for the coming of the Lord and the celebration of Jesus coming as a babe in Bethlehem. Therefore, Advent embodies a vital element of the Christian faith. The Advent season has marked the beginning of the Christian Year since the eight-century and consists of the four weeks before Christmas.

Color: Purple (violet or Lilac) is the color used to denote royalty, praying, fasting, and penitence. It represents a symbol of the majesty of Christ, and Jesus' humanity, suffering, and fasting.

Believing Promises

Devotional Reading: Psalm 99

Scripture: 2 Peter 1:1-15

EXALT!

¹ Simeon Peter, a servant and apostle of Jesus Christ, to those who have received a faith as precious as ours through the righteousness of our God and Savior Jesus Christ:

² May grace and peace be yours in abundance in the knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord.

³ His divine power has given us everything needed for life and godliness, through the knowledge of him who called us by his own glory and goodness. 4 Thus he has given us, through these things, his precious and very great promises, so that through them you may escape from the corruption that is in the world because of lust, and may become participants of the divine nature. For this very reason, you must make every effort to support your faith with goodness, and goodness with knowledge, 6 and knowledge with self-control, and self-control with endurance, and endurance with godliness, ⁷ and godliness with mutual affection, and mutual affection with love. 8 For if these things are yours and are increasing among you, they keep you from being ineffective and unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. 9 For anyone who lacks these things is short-sighted and blind, and is forgetful of the cleansing of the past sins. ¹⁰ Therefore, brothers and sisters, be all the more eager to confirm your call and election, for if you do this, you will never stumble. 11 For in this way, entry into the eternal kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ will be richly provided for you.

12 Therefore I intend to keep on reminding you of these things, though you know them already and are established in the truth that has come to you.
13 I think it right, as long as I am in this body, to

refresh your memory, ¹⁴ since I know that my death will come soon, as indeed our Lord Jesus Christ has made clear to me. ¹⁵ And I will make every effort so that after my departure you may be able at any time to recall these things.

Affirmation: "For the Son of God. Jesus Christ, whom we proclaimed among you...was not 'Yes and No' but in him it is always 'Yes.' For in him everyone of God's promises is a 'Yes.'" (2 Corinthians 1:19-20)

ENGAGE

Faith depends and relies on God's promises to us. These promises are at the root and foundation of our lives and sustain us daily. We live in the confidence that God will perform and do what God has promised. God will never fail us!

Of course, some promises mean more than others. The value we place on a promise made often depends on the one who is making the promise. We consider if the person making the promise is dependable, has a good track record of keeping promises and is trustworthy. When people prove to be untrustworthy or unreliable, we generally want to diminish our interactions with them. We would prefer to have an honest "no" to a dishonest "yes."

There are many reasons for us to be cynical and skeptical as we look out on the landscape of our world. Still, by trusting God and believing God's Word, we have learned how we can keep our balance through life by depending and trusting God's promises, which never fail.

EDUCATE

Biblical scholars do not agree on the authorship of 2 Peter. It is considered to be unlikely to have been written by the Apostle Peter because the letter reflects evidence of events past the lifetime of Simon Peter. Therefore, it is the position of some scholars that 2Peter was written by an early Christian teacher giving instruction to the church and writing in Peter's name.

This possibility of questionable authorship does not

diminish the value of this epistle, however. The epistle espouses the theological concepts of traditional Christian Young man, and Life's Greatest Lesson, Mitch Albom faith. 2 Peter opens with an authoritative apostolic voice addressing what may be a new generation of believers who share the same faith as past generations. The writer lists virtues in verses 5-7 that have much in common with lists from other writings of that era, such as Galatians 5:22-23; Ephesians 4:2-3, 32; Philippians 4:8.

The writer is not speaking of faith in this context as personal belief or trust, but to the content of faith, itself. This generation of believers is urged to continue in the traditions handed down to them. The passage here echoes the sentiment of the song about that "old time religion," which claimed, "it was good for my dear mother, it's good enough for me."

In 2 Peter 1:5-9, the writer admonishes the new generation of believers by listing several necessary elements of character that followers of Christ should display daily. The writer urges these Christians to earnestly and diligently develop these characteristics, adding one to the other. These behaviors may be deemed "ethical" and right for anyone to do, but we note how the author adds the flavor of Christian character to this list. "For this very reason, you must make every effort to support your faith with goodness, and goodness with knowledge, and knowledge with self-control, and self-control with endurance, and endurance with godliness, and godliness with mutual affection, and mutual affection with love. For if these things are yours and are increasing among you, they keep you from being ineffective and unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. For anyone who lacks these things is nearsighted and blind, and is forgetful of the cleansing of past sins."

As we follow Jesus' example, with the assistance and guidance of the Holy Spirit, this pleases God. We learn and see as we follow Jesus' example that Peter describes both our faith and the promises of God as "precious." this is not without good reason. God's promises can always be relied upon, and will never fail.

Because of our trust in God' promises that we are certain never waver - as the epistle of James remind us. "Every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change" (James 1:17), we are sure God will keep the promises made now and in the future. Anyone who chooses not to live this way - and this reprimand includes both false teachers and those who follow them - have both forgotten their past and denied the future.

ELEVATE

In the book Tuesday with Morrie: An Old Man, a pens a memoir about the wisdom he gleaned from Morrie Schwartz, his former sociology professor who is dying of ALS (also known as "Lou Gehrig's Disease"). The memoir is a collection of the life lessons Albom gleaned by visiting with Schwartz every Tuesday to discuss the meaning of life. One of the gems of wisdom that Schwartz share with Albom is how "the culture we have does not make people feel people feel good about themselves. We're teaching the wrong things. 11

Do you agree with Schwartz? As we examine the values our culture celebrates, are we "teaching the wrong things?"

As we are instructed in the ways of God, we can see that we do not have to be co-opted into behaving as the culture around us does or wants us to do. It will take courage and discipline to "stick to your faith" and "believe God's promises," but God's grace will see you through!

I THINK:

- Consider the excuses people give for not living a godly lifestyle. Contrast those excuses with verse 3 of the text. Discuss how we respond to God's call and actualize God's power for godliness.
- Do you believe that temptation or distractions to godly living are worse or more challenging in this day and age than in times past? Why or why not?

(Misfortune from page 1) we feel we've been visited by the divine kind of a miracle. Honestly, it is a stretch to just call any extraordinary event a 'miracle'.

In his book on miracles, Tony Coscia of Colchester, the author of Tony's 50,000 Co-Incidence Miracles, thinks just like me. We both agree that if you pay attention to the events of your daily life, you can acquire the trained eyes and perceptive intuition that would allow you to distinguish several events that can be safely and honestly considered miraculous - almost to the divine level – as against those of the ordinary, analogous ones. Culturally, we frequently call certain events co-incidences, but when you repeatedly step into co-incidences, it's about time to pay more attention.

This is where I come in. With this essay, I am going to blow your mind with this spectacular series of events. You have to be the judge. In a series of events that span over three years, you will have to follow the sequences, grab the bigger picture and then finally come to some conclusion before you can make up your decision. So stay with me on this.

I've been driving my current car for the past thirteen years. It is my fervent desire to try and hit the two hundred thousand mileage before I start thinking about replacing it. About three years ago, right after I returned from a year stay in Albuquerque, New Mexico, I rented several music CDs from the local library and played them repeatedly in my car. They kept me company and entertained me on my various rides around and about the area. Even as far as driving to Toronto, Canada while peacefully listening to those CDs on my car's stereo system. When it came time to return those CD to the library, after exhausting the renewal limits, I discovered that I could not eject them from the machine. They were stuck.

I explained my predicament to the librarians and pleaded with them for

more time to allow me to find any ways to get those CDs out. In all, I had two CDs from the library and four others of my own. Two of which were my most treasured copies of Pete Seeger songs, that he personally gave to me. Of course, I had exhausted the various suggestions on YouTube on how to get you nonworking CD player to spit out the CDs from within. During this period you can bet that I had also been to the original car dealers and enquired from them as to how on earth I could get my CDs out. Each technician gave the same refrain – to replace the 'broken' system with a newer one. Minimum \$1,200 and all would be 'kosher', so they implied.

I actually visited two local joints that dealt exclusively with high-end, after-market car stereo and navigation systems. The verdict was always the same. Sure it could be done, with a newer replacement system, but no guarantees as to the functioning of the existing navigation system. My best bet was to replace the entire stereo system for no less than \$800, which I couldn't justify for myself. In the end, I had to bite the bullet. Go to the library and ask for mercy. Their lenient decision was to forgive me the overdue fees, but to make me pay for the cost of the two CDs at \$20 each. I was given the empty cases with the receipt of payment and therefore ownership. The worse part of the ordeal was the feeling of having 'taken' a public property and being forced to pay for my misdeeds. Did they believe me? I thought maybe they didn't. That was utterly humiliating, to say the least.

At this point if you have stayed with me from the beginning, everything you have read so far constitute the bigger picture. You need to know those preambles leading to the big event. As a result of the lack of CD playing capability, I had started in my mind to start the exercise of looking to replace this car. After all, I've owned it for over ten years and what better time to get a newer car than now, when the CD player does not work. But I call it an exercise because it takes me close to

a year and hundreds of test drives before I officially commit to a buy any car. Not just any car, but one that really has all the bells and whistles as well as the comfort and the reliability that has to be endorsed by non less than the 'consumer report' magazine. I have a history of signing on the dotted line and still refusing to take delivery. Not to mention the one several years ago, that I returned over the weekend, back to dealers, to get my money back. So, as I tell all car sales people; 'you really have to leave me to make the final decision. Any form of coercion will certainly backfire. My conscience will lead me back to the lot only to return what I consider non-personal decision'.

Two weeks ago, I discovered that my high beams were not working as usual. The internet is awash with all the various ways to replace them. So, I took on the challenge. I went to the auto parts store and bought the high-end Sylvania replacement bulbs for my car. One sunny afternoon, I decided to just do it. I had seen it done so many times in several YouTube videos, that I felt, I could do this in my sleep. I followed the basics and finally got to the first bulb on the left side of the car. After a few tested moments, when I couldn't just pry off the bulb, I finally got it. Eureka moment! I successfully replaced the dead bulb with the new one and put it back into the socket where it belonged in the lamp assembly. One down, one to go.

Now, was the testing time. I had to repeat this feat on the right side of the car. But that is where the auxiliary battery sits. And none of the so-called experts on YouTube ever mentioned the fact that the battery may have to come down first, in order to be able to maneuver my wrists properly to grab the bulb from the assembly. But as luck will have it; really, in my personal realm of things, it is the other way round. The better perspective has nothing to do with luck. It is part of my firm belief that 'every misfortune is a potential blessing'. I have lived with this adage all my life, and it had never failed me

yet. The battery I was looking at was installed by yours truly a couple of months back when the previous one gave up the ghost too soon within the given warrantee. I had called the number on the battery and had been instructed to go to the nearest Napa auto store for replacement. I did but since I could not drive the car over to the store, the salesman at the time did me a favor and asked one of his associates to bring me home with the replacement battery, and left on my own to do the installation. The misfortune at that time, ended up being my blessing of expertise on how to handle the auxiliary battery of a hybrid car.

Now fast forward all these months to now, when I was facing the battery which stood so prominently in my way of getting to the right side head beam bulb. I

subsequently remembered how I put it in, and therefore reversed the routine and took off the battery. It still took me a couple of minutes to finally get the bulb to come out and be replaced. Success was mine. In all I had the battery off for up to 25 minutes, plus the effort of cleaning, dusting and wiping it off before putting it back meant it must have been out for a total of 45 minutes, at least. But now, I had the two bulbs in place. I had the battery back where it belonged and I had the luxury of wiping the rest of the engine and replacing all the plugs and clips that held the covers in place. I had this nagging feeling that I had gradually gained a few inches to my height. To say I was overjoyed and elated is an understatement. I was on cloud nine! But now was time to test my accomplishment. I got back in the car, turned the key in the ignition for the 'ready' symbol. Hybrid engines

do not turn as other engines do. You just get a symbol of 'ready' that indicates that all is set to drive off. But that moment, all I could hear was the rumbling sound of the CDs jostling to come out, or so it seems. I was startled at first. But then I came to my senses and realized to my astonishment that the CD player was resetting or refreshing or reshuffling or all of the above. As I told my brother later, as I quickly figured out what was happening, I actually danced in the seat of my car and had a moment of pure, divine joy that transcended many of my prior pleasant surprises. I managed to eject all CDs and then to load and play some tracks of some of them. The CD player never sounded better than that moment.

A moment of a true miracle! That is what I say. What do you think? By Kwame Ocansey

Today's Bible Reading: Matthew 1:18-25

- 18 This is how the birth of Jesus the Messiah came about: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, ccording to an old story, a man named Nicholas (born in AD 270) heard about a Spirit. To Because Joseph her husband was faithful to the law, and yet did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly.
 - 20 But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹ She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins."
 - ²² All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: 23 "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel" (which means "God with us").
 - ²⁴ When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home as his wife. 25 But he did not consummate their marriage until she gave birth to a son. And he gave him the name Jesus.

Today's text introduces us to Joseph, a carpenter in Nazareth and step-father of Jesus. Joseph is only mentioned briefly in Scripture but he's never the speaker; however, his life speaks volumes of his devotion to God. He's concerned for the law and desires to act in obedience (Matthew 1:19), yet he pairs that concern with genuine compassion for Mary. His focus on obedience is likewise balanced by trust that the message he's received from the angel is from Godgiving him strength to obey (VV. 22-25).

AFTER MONTHS OF EAGER ANTICIPATION, THE DAY FINALLY ARRIVES. YOU PACK YOUR BAGS AND OFF YOU GO. SERVAL HOURS LATER THE PLANE LANDS. THE FLIGHT ATTENDANT COMES IN AND SAYS, "WELCOME TO HOLLAND.

"HOLLAND!!!" YOU SAY, "WHAT DO YOU MEAN HOLLAND! I SIGNED UP FOR ITALY. I'M SUPPORT TO BE IN ITALY! ALL MY LIFE I'VE DREAMED OF GOING TO ITALY."

BUT THERE'S A CHANCE IN THE FLIGHT PLAN. THEY LANDED IN HOLLAND AND YOU MUST STAY. THE IMPORTANT THING IS THAT THEY HAVEN'T TAKEN YOU TO A HORRIBLE, DISGUSTING, FILTHY PLACE, FULL OF PESTILENCE, FAMINE AND DISEASE. IT'S JUST A DIFFERENT PLANE.

Know God's Character

Oh taste and see that the Lord is good; Blessed is the man who trusts in Him! Psalms 34:8 KJV

It's important that we know God's character. Why? It gives us discernment. If we don't know the character of God, how can we ever know who is from God and who is not from God? Here are three character traits of God that help me stay in tune with who He is and what He is doing:

1. Justice: God is a God of justice. That word justice is so awesome because it means that He will always make anything that's wrong right. This helps me to not worry when I am

mistreated because I know God will bring justice. It's who He is.

- 2. Goodness: God is good, this fact never changes. And He's good all the time, not just once in a while or when things go your way. Psalm 34:8 says, "Taste and see that the LORD is good; blessed is the man who takes refuse in him" (NIV). When things are bad, I find great encouragement in God's goodness.
- 3. Holiness: God is holy and righteous, and He desires to make us holy, pure and clean, free from the defilements of sin. To be honest, it has helped me in my walk with God to realize that whatever He does is right, whether I like it or not. This helps me stay in sync with Him.

These three traits are not the only characteristic of God, but they are some of the most significant and powerful ones to me. I encourage you to spend some time looking up these traits, and other traits of God that are important to you. When you study who He is, the Holy Spirit will help you incorporate His traits into your own personality. Begin to practice them in your daily life, and see what God does... You won't be disappointed.

A Bird's Eye View Of The Bible

Old Testament

There are 39 books in the Old Testament library.
There are four types of writing in the Old Testament:
Law, History, Poetry, Prophecy.

It is helpful to know which kind of literature you are reading before you start: is it poetry, or is it history?

LAW Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy.

The first five books of the Bible are sometimes called the a Law of Moses. They give many of God's laws about how to live.

HISTORY

Joshua, Judges, Ruth, 1&2 Samuel, 1&2 Kings, 1&2 Chronicles, Ezra, Nehemiah, Esther.

These 12 historical books cover the occupation of the Promised Land, the time of the Judges, Israel's kings, the fall of the two kingdoms and a return to Jerusalem.

POETRY Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, Song of Songs.

Nearly one third of the Old Testament is written in poetry. These five poetical books ask profound questions about evil, pain, love, wisdom and God.

PROPHECY

Isaiah, Jeremiah, Lamentations, Ezekiel, Daniel, Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah, Malachi.

The 17 prophetical books account for almost a quarter of the Bible. They are divided into "Major Prophets" (the first five books) and, "Minor Prophets" (the last 12). The "Minor" ones are shorter, not less important.

New Testament

There are 27 books in the New Testament library
There are three types of writing in the New Testament:
History, Letters, Prophecy.

Before you study a New Testament book it helps to consider what kind of literature you are reading: is it a letter or is it history?

HISTORY Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, Acts

The first four books, called gospels, are not like our modern biographies. But they do give four portraits of Jesus. Acts is part two of Luke, about the early church.

LETTERS PAUL'S LETTERS

Romans, 1 Corinthians, 2 Corinthians, Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, 1 Thessalonians, 2 Thessalonians, 1 Timothy, 2 Timothy, Titus, Philemon.

We have 13 of Paul's letters. Expect for one personal one, Philemon, they were all written to groups of Christians.

OTHER LETTERS Hebrews, James, 1 Peter, 2 Peter, 1 John, 2 John, 3 John, Jude.

We don't know who wrote Hebrews. Tradition states that all the writers of the New Testament, except for John, were martyred.

PHOPHECY Revelation

Written by the apostle John, this book has seven letters to churches and numerous visions about God.



Insight

Paul motivates the Corinthian church by citing the inspiring example of the Macedonians. He's also asking for generosity that will demonstrate unity between churches. Division between the Jewish and gentile believers in Jesus plagued the early church. By giving to the church in Jerusalem, gentile disciples of Christ in Corinth and Macedonia would be contributing to a Jewish congregation, sending an implicit message of love and acceptance. Paul further notes how the Macedonian believers faced severe trials, yet gave out of "overflowing joy" and "extreme poverty" (2 Corinthians 8:2-3). This joy is a natural response to "the grace that God has given the Macedonian churches" (V. 1). Our circumstances don't destroy our ability to give, and they can't steal the joy that flows out of the grace God gives us Tim Gustafson
