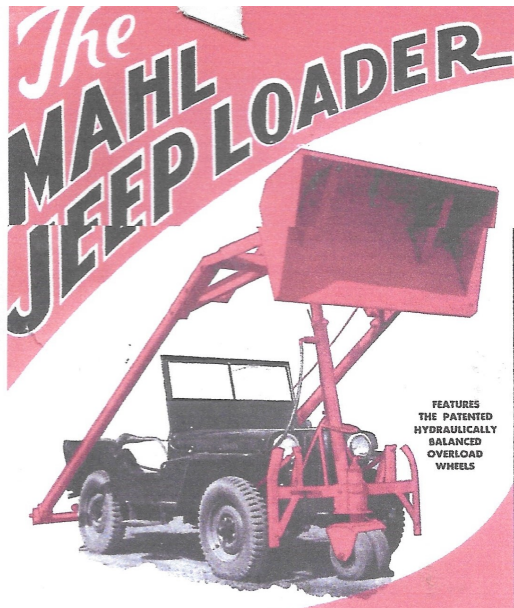

## WHAT IS IT ?

### Front End Loaders for CJ Jeeps

Several manufacturers made front end loaders that could be mounted on CJ Jeeps. Some units used a cable and hydraulic cylinders to raise the bucket. One such manufacturer built these from 1948 until 1953 with 300 units sold. The Jeep with 4-wheel drive made the use of a loader viable but in no way were they to be considered for heavy duty work. Many other implements were made to promote the Jeep for a farm tractor replacement after the end of World War II. The returning soldiers were familiar with the Jeeps in the war and thought they could be useful on the farm.

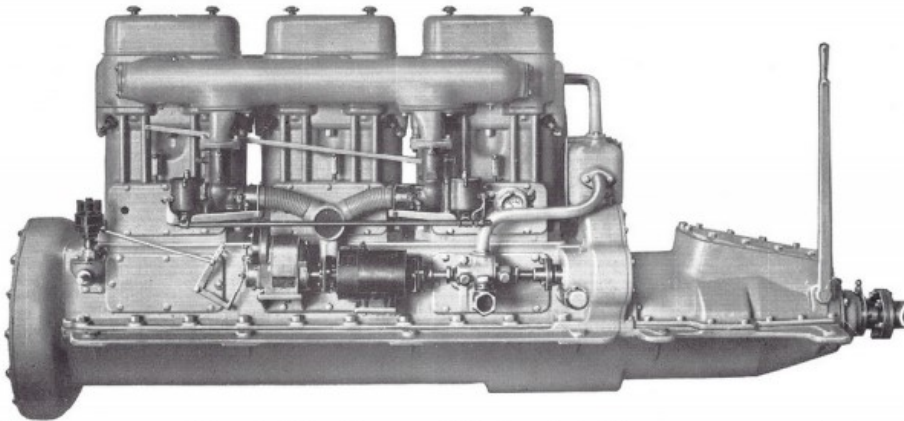


### What is it ?

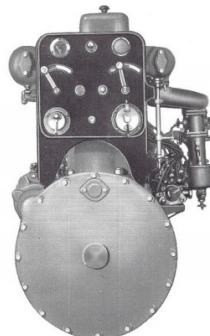
## Little Known Facts

In 1905 a small company began selling engines to a new automobile company; Pierce Arrow.

It was established by a couple of unknown gentlemen/ engineers, and it was just 1890. Like any new company, the early years were difficult. But by 1901 they were selling engines to the marine industry. This engine had some early designs that were later adapted by most engine companies, such as individual drip oilers ported through drilled passages in the block. Soon their design was pumped through the crankshaft. These early engines had enclosed valve system and offered a magneto for a variety of cylinders up to and including a V24 engine. Their early cam was operated like today's auto engines with a timing chain. They even produced a 40-horsepower engine with dual overhead cam shafts. These early engines had 4 valves per cylinder. Such technology was way ahead of its time.

This engine company held the longest life cycle of any engine to date. And by 1957 several of their engines were logging over 50 years of service with minimal repairs. The company's name: The Buffalo Engine Company.
