Days For Girls workshop

On Saturday, January 13th, several members of SIGP attended a Days For Girls (DFG) workshop at the Grosse Pointe Methodist Church. After packing 75 Days for Girls kits, we listened to Dr. Joyce Purakal and Dr. Carol Abiragi who are planning to take DFG kits to Africa and Krysta Forrester, a Wayne State University student who has distributed DFG kits in Africa on two occasions. The two doctors are members of HART (Haiti and Africa Relief Team) which is a volunteer organization that provides aid to those in need in Haiti and Africa. These two doctors have been travelling to Africa for several years with a team of doctors. They see patients from morning until night in a

makeshift clinic. Both doctors commented on how grateful the people are for any small gestures. This year they are excited to bring 75 DFG kits to distribute to girls aged 12-18 in the local village they will be serving. They will also share the menstrual cycle information to these girls. We look forward to hearing their feedback after their trip.

Krysta was part of a group of nursing students from Wayne State that brought DFG kits to Africa 2 years ago. She went

again with another group last year. Krysta is very passionate about educating the young girls of Africa about the DFG kits and providing much needed sex education training. She was able to tell us firsthand about the distribution challenges, the cultural differences and the reaction by the girls to receiving the kits and the information. She also answered many questions that Dr. Joyce and Dr. Carol had about their upcoming trip.

This was a very inspirational presentation. Listening to these women talk and hearing about what it is actually like in these underprivileged countries was heart breaking. It really gave us a sense that the DFG kits are truly making an impact in the lives of some very needy girls.

Exciting News!

Robin Wilson, a friend of our LYD Award Winner, Sara Baker, was a guest speaker at our October meeting. She discussed her plans to apply for a Fulbright scholarship and her ideas for improving the literacy rate among women and girls in Senegal.

Robin recently learned that she was selected as a Fulbright semi-finalist by the National Screening Committee of the Institute of International Education (IIE) for the 2018-19 Fulbright U.S. Student Program. That means that her application has been forwarded to the supervising agency abroad for the next stage of the review process.

Additionally, her application will be forwarded to the program sponsor, the Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs of the United States Department of State, for transmittal to the presidentially-appointed J. William Fulbright Foreign Scholarship Board



(FFSB). The FFSB makes final decisions on Fulbright awards.

In March 2018, Robin will have a final decision from the FFSB on her selection to teach in Senegal. Robin stated that she is, "extremely

excited and honored" and wanted to "share this information with the members of the Soroptimist International of Grosse Pointe."

MEET AN SIGP SOROPTIMIST

THE WRITE WAY at the War Memorial

When she was a sophomore at Grosse Pointe North, Sarah Sheppard took a creative writing class that was supposed to be for juniors and seniors.

"I knew then, right away," she says. "I was a writer."

Today — 10 years later — she is on the brink of completing her first novel.

"It's about a woman in her late 20s who moves from New York City to the Midwest."

She pegged her novel as women's fiction, a category which typically features a female protagonist and deals with women's issues.

Sheppard earned a BA in English from St. Mary's College in Indiana and a MFA with a concentration in fiction from Lesley University in Boston. While in college, she had a short story, some personal essays and several poems published.

Since college, she has worked in a variety of positions in the publishing industry. She held a senior managing role for a domestic publication. She freelanced for a travel agency, for a law firm, for a business consultant and a marketing agency. She has

written for nonprofits. She taught a personal essay class.

She traveled — by train — around the U.S. for two months. "We had assigned seats for meals — different each day. I met a variety of people with interesting stories to tell. This was wonderful experience for a writer."

Sheppard will teach two classes for aspiring writers at the War Memorial in the coming months. "I am excited about writing and I try to tailor each class to the interests of my students," she says.

"Establishing a Creative Lifestyle" will be offered on Tuesday, Jan. 16. "If you want to live a creative lifestyle, you need to embrace creativity in all its forms," she says. "This includes art, music, poetry, even travel and nature."

"Blogs, Newsletter and Email Writing" will be held Tuesday, Feb. 20. Sheppard will talk about the fundamentals of blogging, cover the guidelines for writing newsletters and teach a few tricks about how to pitch stories to various markets.

"My goal is to finish my novel by the new year, then find an agent and a traditional publisher."

She writes at home, in coffee shops and in the library. "I try to write in the mornings. I aim for a certain number of words each day. Some days are easier than others, but building a writing routine is important."

She's currently freelancing for a law firm and a marketing agency and sending her short stories to various publications.

Her all-time favorite novels? And the Mountains Echoed by Khaled Hosseini and East of Eden by John Steinbeck. She admires the work of writers Joan Didion, Alice Munro, Adam Haslett and poet Lucille Clifton.

BOARD MEMBER RESPONSIBILITIES

The President shall

- 1. direct the conduct of the business of the Club;
- 2. set meeting agendas for Club and Board meetings;
- 3. preside at Club and Board meetings;
- 4. oversee all committees, working closely with the President-Elect and Vice-President;
- 5. be an ex-officio member of all committees, except nominating;
- 6. sign all checks in the absence of the treasurer;
- 7. appoint delegates from a list of district, region, Federation, or International meetings;
- 8. serve as the club delegate at district, region, Federation, and International meetings, or appoint an alternate from a list of meeting attendees.

The President-Elect agrees (program chair)

- 1. to assume the office of president at the end of her two-year term;
- 2. shall be responsible for program of service committees;
- 3. shall have such duties and powers as arise from membership on the board or as assigned by the president or the Board.

The Vice-President shall (membership chair)

- 1. be responsible for the activities of the membership activities;
- 2. shall have such duties and powers as arise from membership on the Board or as assigned by the President or the Board.

The Secretary shall

- 1. keep the minutes of the Club and the Board meetings;
- 2. be custodian of The Club's permanent records;
- 3. submit to the membership the minutes of the business meetings and the recommendations of the Board;
- 4. submit to the Board the minutes of the Board meetings;
- 5. send out notices and carry on such correspondence as does not properly belong to other officers.

The Assistant Secretary shall (public awareness chair)

- 1. maintain a log of attendance at Club business meetings;
- 2. fulfill the responsibilities of the secretary in her absence;
- 3. perform any other duties assigned by the president or the secretary;
- 4. be responsible for overseeing public awareness.

The Treasurer shall

- 1. receive all funds of the Club and deposit them in financial institutions authorized by the Board;
- 2. sign all checks or arrange for the president to do so;
- 3. make remittances as required by Federation Bylaws and Procedures;
- 4. prepare monthly Treasurer's Reports for each of the Club funds serve as ex-officio member of the Finance/Budget Committee;
- 5. have the authority to define and supervise committee procedures as they relate to the finances of the club

The Assistant Treasurer shall (fundraising chair)

- 1. be responsible for overseeing fund raising;
- 2. maintain a roll of membership (directory);
- 3. prepare and send acknowledgements for donations from non-members;
- 4. assume the responsibilities of the treasurer in her absence;
- 5. serve as ex-officio member of the finance/budget committee;
- 6. perform any other duties assigned by the president or the treasurer.




