He sold Fuller Brushes and worked for the postal service before beginning his 30 year career with the Sebewaing Police Department, serving as Chief of Police for 29 of those years. Dale was a lifelong member of New Salem Lutheran Church from baptism to confirmation to serving on the finance committee for over 56 years. He was a Sebewaing J.C., a member of the Lions, a Huron County Commissioner, served on the Mental Health Board for 13 years, along with many other community organizations. One of Dale's greatest joys was impacting the youth in and around the area in positive ways.
