

### VACATION. IS. OVER! By Rev. Mark

There is just something...palpable in the air when school starts, isn't there? (Mary Flint says it's because, no matter HOW nice the weather is the week BEFORE school starts, it's going to be 105 degrees with a heat index of a million WHEN school starts!) But you know what I mean- there is just a different feel to life when school starts back up. (Hunter is ...gasp!...a Freshman in college!)

This time of year reminds us that things change. We get into the rhythm of summer and life has a different pace. But then fall comes and we remember that the leisurely pace of summer simply can't continue- it's time to roll up our sleeves and get back to work.

That fact is not only true of life in general- it's true of the Church specifically. Churches usually slow down in the summer. Attendance drops, giving drops... people have other things going on. But you know what? That wasn't so much the case here this summer. What that tells me is this- our congregation is growing. We enter the Fall averaging over 280 people/week in worship. And when THAT happens, well...vacation is over! You see, we WANT to grow. We WANT more people in worship. WHY? Because our stated mission is to connect people to Jesus Christ. And if connecting 280+ people to Jesus Christ every Sunday is good...then connecting 380+ people to Jesus Christ every Sunday is even BETTER!

Here's my challenge to you this fall- greet everybody you can when you come to church on Sunday...or Wednesday, or Tuesday, or...!) Make a point, force yourself if necessary, to initiate contact. Walk up, stick out your hand and say, "Welcome!" or "Good morning!" or "Glad you're here!" or "I don't believe we've met. My name is..." If everybody brought just ONE new person into the church this year...ONE person in a YEAR...we will have doubled our size in that one year! Imagine that!

In the end, people don't want to be dazzled by shiny programs and spiffy ad campaigns. They want to see that Jesus Christ is making a difference in YOUR life. And when they see that, they will want that in THEIR life. And that will enable us to connect MORE people to Jesus Christ!

Much has been written about developing and practicing effective leadership skills. Books by Jim Collins, Stephen Covey, Dale Carnegie, Jack Welch and Lee Iacocca, to name just a few, have addressed this topic from several perspectives. Thousands of articles have also delved into this subject. But what IS leadership? And who does it apply to?

On Sunday, September 9th, we start a brand-new sermon series- Are You Leading or Taking a Walk? This series is NOT simply for "church leaders" but for...everyone. We are ALL called to be leaders- in our homes, our church, our community and the world. We are called to help lead by connecting people to Jesus Christ. This series will focus on the qualities of a good leader and the weeks of the series look like this:

### Sunday, September 9, 2018- Honesty & Integrity (John 1:43-46)

Great leaders help create a culture built on a foundation of honesty and integrity. (Proverbs 12:12, John 8:31-32 **Sunday, September 16- <u>Self-Awareness</u>** (John 1:47-50) A great leader understands their own strengths and weaknesses.

(Proverbs 21:1-2, 1Corinthians 13:12)

Sunday, September 23- Vision (Luke 5:9-11)

Strong leaders see the big picture and don't get too focused on specific tasks. (Proverbs 29:18, Acts 1:8)

Sunday, September 30- Courage (Luke 5:9-11)

The strongest leaders are confident in themselves and their ideas, which allows them to be decisive.

(Joshua 1:7-9, Philippians 4:12-13)

Sunday October 7- Communication (Luke 6:12-16)

Great leaders don't have to be great speakers or exceptional writers. They need to be inspirational and persuasive.

(Proverbs 15:1-2, Colossians 4:5-6)

Sunday, October 14- Team Building (Luke 1-11)

Great leaders build teams. This requires, first and foremost, the ability to attract and retain top talent. (Proverbs 27:17, Matthew 18:19-20)

## LABOR DAY

The first Labor Day was celebrated on Tuesday, September 5, 1882, in New York City. The first proposal of the holiday described it as a street parade to exhibit to the public "the strength and esprit de corps of the trade and labor organizations," followed by a festival for the workers and their families. In 1884 the first Monday in September was selected as the holiday. The idea spread with the growth of labor organizations and on June 28, 1894, Congress made it a federal holiday. It originated as a "day off for the working citizens" and now is celebrated by most Americans as the symbolic end of summer. In addition, Labor Day marks the beginning of the NFL and college football seasons. The NCAA usually plays their first games the week before Labor Day, with the NFL traditionally playing their first game the Thursday following Labor Day. Celebrate the working men and women of our country on Monday the 3rd!
