

#### Pausing at the Lakeshore -----

#### ----- With Pastor Eric

<sup>1</sup> Once while Jesus was standing beside the lake of Gennesaret, <sup>4</sup> When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch." <sup>5</sup> Simon answered, "Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets." <sup>6</sup> When they had done this, they

caught so many fish that their nets were beginning to break. <sup>7</sup> So they signaled their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both boats, so that they began to sink. <sup>8</sup> But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!" <sup>9</sup> For he and all who were with him were amazed at the catch of fish that they had taken; <sup>10</sup> and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. Then Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people." <sup>11</sup> When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him. – Luke 5:1, 4-11

I was caught off guard recently by one of my own sermons. I preached the Lukan account of Jesus gathering his first disciples at the lakeshore. Jesus taught from Simon's boat and then had Simon go into deep water for a catch of fish. Simon had not caught anything all night but did as Jesus directed. The fish were so numerous that other boats need to come out and help bring in the multitude of fish. What caught my attention was the response of Simon to such amazing success. He begged Jesus to go away from him because he is a sinful man. What an odd response to success? I'm not sure that those involved would have thought to attribute such abundant fishing to Jesus. Simon did...He saw the truth behind the success and realized that it was bigger than him.

Jesus responded with the phrase "from now on you will catch people." Here are some observations that I invite us all to consider this Lent.

- Whether we are fishermen, farmers, engineers, teachers, pastors, whatever our vocations, Jesus calls and equips us to follow him. We are children of God and disciples no matter what we do for a job. Listening to Jesus bears fruit in all situations.
- 2.) Success is not ours alone. Simon had Jesus, and his fellow fishermen to bring in the enormous catch of fish. We should appreciate and give thanks to God and those who participate in whatever success we experience.
- 3.) Repentance is key when living a Christian life. It frees us to accept and learn from our failures and make different choices. It takes the weight of our worries, fears off our backs in exchange for God's grace and faithfulness. It helps us receive and give because we know that it's not about "me". It provides an openness to forgiving others because we all sin and we acknowledge that fact.

Lent is a time to reflect on our spiritual journey with God. We can read biblical stories and seek out our own stories within them. In 2025, we will reflect upon the teachings of Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount and pay special attention to the seven last words of Jesus from the cross which is our most intimate and profound moment with God.

Let us pray. Gracious Father, reveal to us the depth of love and life that Jesus provides this Lent season, so that we may experience our story in Jesus's story with depth and conviction. May we repent and grow in relationship with you with courage, in Jesus's name we pray. Amen.





- Up to 90 lives saved or sustained!!






