

Clifford Township Supervisors Meeting October 11, 2016

Business meeting held on Tuesday October 11, 2016. Chairman Dennis Knowlton called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. Motion to approve the minutes by Mr. Knowlton, second by Mr. Searle. All in favor. Treasurer's report reviewed and will be put on file. List of bills reviewed. Mr. Knowlton made a motion to pay bills except Clifford Auto and Clifford Supply, seconded by Mr. Marcho. All in favor. New Business: September 18th was set to work on the 2017 budget at 6:30.

Mr. Searle made a motion to pass a resolution for plan revision for new land development for the Kaufman property. Seconded by Mr. Knowlton. All in favor.

Mr. Searle made a motion send a letter to the county with limited support of an ordinance on clean air. Seconded by Mr. Knowlton. All in favor.

Mr. Searle reported that he attended the Endless Mountain Heritage Region meeting. He reported that Clifford is predominant in several partnerships. The Historical Society was do a great job for the township.

Road report: Mr. Marcho is hoping to get the sluice pipes on Elkview drive replaced and reported that a new pipe was replaced on Wells road. Cinders and salt for the winter has been delivered.

Planning Commission: Mr. Clementoni reported that an advertised public meeting for the zoning ordinance will be on November 9th. Mr. Knowlton made a motion to have the meeting. Seconded by Mr. Searle. All in favor.

Tax Collector: Mrs. Bennett reported for Mrs. Price that \$1045.44 real estate and \$87.14 in fire protection was collected last month for 89% for the year.

Historical Society: Mrs. Wilnot reported that the cider mill was painted red. The Historical society will be having a raffle for 50/50 to help fund the work being done on the children's garden, cider mill and museum.
