Regular Meeting -----March 8, 1990

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, D. L. Taylor at 7:00 A.M. at the District office. Other Board members present were Jim Walker, John Groo and Gary Wilson. ATTENDANCE

Special Service District members present were Dan Holyoak, George White and Gary Wilson.

Others present were Dale Pierson, Marsha Modine and Ferne Mullen.

After calling for corrections or additions, the Chair declared the minutes approved as amended with Bill McDougald added as present at the meeting. MINUTES

A discussion was held concerning the work being done on wells used to provide supplemental water to the Moab Irrigation Company. The Deloy Lance well was pulled and will be sent to Monroe Supply in Grand Junction for testing. The pump was set at 65' and it pumped air, Deloy thinks it was set too high. The well is 200' deep so the pump could be set deeper. Deloy thought that when the well was originally set deeper it pumped sand. Maybe higher perforations would help. Axtell pulled the pump. Horace will bail it out. Deloy said this well would begin pumping at 250 gpm and drop back to 180 and then start pumping air. Mark Page will be contacted to see if there is a well log. WELL REPAIRS

Horace told Gary Wilson that the Cemetery Well ought to be back together soon. He is short four rods. Jim Walker said that the Irrigation Co. started to use their water about three weeks ago. A pump has been ordered from Monroe Supply for the Howard Lance well - 7 1/2 hp 3 stage (200-225); it should be here next week. Pump quotes were: Delco Western quote \$1880; Horace \$1784; Monroe \$1463.40; Intermountain Farmers \$1997.40 (delivered). Freight from Monroe was 60.00 factory direct. Jim Walker moved and Dan Holyoak seconded to buy pump from Monroe.

George is holding up on his new well until he gets his paper work done. Mark Page is on his way thru and will stop this morning. G.WHITE WELL #5

Marsha discussed the power company's AGA - annual guaranteed amount. As long as we use as much as we guarantee in our contracts with UP&L, the AGA builds up as a credit. UP&L-AGA

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Dale did a projection and guesses we ought to have 60% water availability this season based on 1977 stream flows. Presently we are at 1202 AF in the Lake which is approximately 50%. Dale projects that if we use only lake water we will run out about mid July. The Golf Course's UP&L bill last year was in excess of \$19,000. It might behoove us to refund their money and let them pump from the beginning. The city's wells may not be on an irrigation rate. If the Golf Course will not take their money back, then we will have to make sure they are on an irrigation rate and using efficiently. We should be consistent and only pay for their purchased AF. GW#4 averaged at \$22.50/AF last year; Corbin and Beeman wells \$25/AF. The Beeman well pumped 170.4 AF and the Corbin well had 422.496 AF pumped last year. Horace told George if we leased his well, we ought to pay for AF used. We are looking at valving the system off below Lammerts and leaving that upper section on lake water and pump the lower section. The Board discussed wells and strategies for cheapest supplementing. The Lake is gaining about 100 AF a week. The City could take the Corbin well back at any time. We need to pin Horace down to a lease figure. He should be invited to the next Board meeting so that a price can be agreed upon. George is planning on having his new well in line for this irrigation season.


Dale and Dan Nelson have tentatively set a seminar date for the last of March.
