The unique Kirkpatrick “Vines on Gourd” vase figural presents a strong religious communication in clay: Vines grow and thrive in difficult conditions, which symbolize the journey of life. John 15:5 states “I am the vine and you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit.”

Gourds are a fruit. This gourd shaped vase represents the fruit of faith. A candle or oil lit in the center of this intricate gourd shaped vase well represents Christ at the center of our Lives, being “The Light of the world.”
