Thirty two SCWD members and guests traveled to the Illinois Railway Museum on Saturday, June 10th for a whole day of viewing lots of full size railroad engines and cars plus numerous other railway related items.



It was Railroad Post Office Day at the Museum, so they had RPO cars being pulled behind a Russian Decapod steam engine followed by connected passenger cars available for riding. Picking up mail bags on the fly was demonstrated on each run.





In addition, period interurban electric railway cars were also available for riding on their mainline, plus an electric street car on their on-grounds track loop.

Although the temperatures were warm, a significant south breeze made the day on the grounds bearable and the smoke from the steam engine blow <u>away</u> from the museum grounds!

Been working on some new models or taking some great photos? This will be the time to share them with others and have them judged by NMRA contest rules—and possibly earn a merit award toward an Achievement Award certificate. Full contest information will be forthcoming.

Our banquet Saturday night will be a great chance to meet other modelers from all over the Midwest Region and to see the model and photo contest winners. In addition, Tony Koester will be our guest speaker. Tony's wry humor will be in evidence as he discusses his 50+ year journey thru model railroading.

The Non-Rails haven't been forgotten, either. There will be craft projects and other activities throughout the convention as well as Project Linus. If you aren't familiar with Project Linus, it is a national activity to create handmade blankets, quilts and afghans for seriously ill children. Sewers of various skills come together to complete projects that are then distributed to needy children. Come see what it is all about.

Sunday Tours 10:00AM to 4:00PM



The Board of Directors meeting for the 2015-2016 South Central Wisconsin Division, Midwest Region, National Model Railroad Association was called to order at 7:00 p.m. on May15, 2017 by Superintendent Bob McGeever.

In attendance were Board members **Dave Lendved**, **Bob McGeever**, **Mike Vivion**, **Phil Hottmann**, **Jerry Lawler**, **Ken Hojnacki**, **Bill Clancy**.

<u>Minutes Approval</u>: Minutes for the April 2017 meeting were approved with amendments as to attendance.

<u>Paymaster Report</u>: Paymaster report was approved. Budget was approved.

Committee Reports:

Achievement Program: Volunteer reports are being created in order to recognize volunteer contributions for the year.

Bad Order: Everything continues to operate smoothly

Clinics: There may be a slight increase in costs for clinics this year. There will also be a photography clinic. Bob Wundrock has lined up and details will be published in the Bad Order.

Contests: Nothing new. Dave Lendved has submitted the list of contests for upcoming year. Dave will proceed with the contest agenda based on BOD approved list of contests. Motion carried and BOD approved.

Modeling Project for 2016-2017: Phil Hottmann agreed to take on responsibility for the modeling project this year. Mike Vivion and several BOD members agreed to help Phil out as needed

Due to costs, there may be an increase in cost of participation or we may reduce the complexity of the project.

Door prizes (Banquet): Bill Weber will be responsible for the banquet door prizes. Marilynn Lawler has been in contact with Sue Bunce and made arrangements to have them delivered prior to the banquet.

Layout tours: We may provide additional uTube video tours of unique layouts. The board discussed including unfinished and smaller layouts included in the tours for the upcoming year. This will allow members to share their thought processes as they design and build new

layouts. It will also allow members to provide feedback/ideas to those building layouts.

Picnic: Picnic date is July 15 and Little Amerika was chosen for this summer. July 15th is the weekend of the 'Whiskey River Days'.

Rail show: See paymaster report. Final financials for the show indicate a small profit.

Spring Trip: Logistics have been confirmed for the trip. It was agreed that the Illinois Railroad Museum will be the destination. Date: June 10th. It will be a one day trip. Group will meet at the Zor Shrine parking lot and will travel from there. Meeting time will be 8am. We have 29 confirmed and a waiting list is being created in the event that we have cancellations.






