

If you've been following the NRA's legal troubles like I have then you know about the unimaginable level of corruption and misuse of funds. If you're like many other people I know, you may be totally unaware of what has been happening.

In 2020, New York Attorney General, Letitia James, filed a lawsuit to dissolve the NRA. During her campaign in 2018 she promised to investigate their finances. So, when the corruption charges first came out, I thought it was all made up, but it turns out NRA leadership was using our dues to pay for their extravagant lifestyle. I decided to stop giving them money until Wayne LaPierre was ousted as the Executive Vice President and they turned the ship around.

Many other members felt the same way, and membership has dropped by more than half; and that means revenue has dropped by more than half. Coupled with the massive expenditures on legal defense, the NRA is dangerously close to bankruptcy!

Well, the first phase of the corruption trial ended in February. LaPierre was found liable for \$5.4 million worth of harm to the NRA and has resigned. At the annual meeting in May, three reformers were elected to the four top leadership positions (including Executive Vice President). I decided it's time to recommit my support to the NRA, so I sent them \$100 to renew my membership for three years. As I see progress on reform, I'll consider additional donations.

Since 1871, the NRA has developed marksmanship and gun safety programs and supported the interests of outdoorsman and gun enthusiasts. Their mission shares much in common with the mission of IWLA.

If you feel like I do, that we need a strong NRA to continue that mission, I suggest you consider financially supporting the NRA now, when they critically need your support. Renew your membership if it has lapsed or give a contribution if you can. If you agree with Letitia James and think the NRA should be dissolved, break out the Champagne and Caviar, because without your help the NRA might be TOAST. — Greg Senft

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Fishing in the pond is restricted to members and their immediate family only
- Fishing in the pond is allowed all year (except during ice-overs)
- All Pennsylvania fishing regulations are to be followed with the exception of those rules outlined here
- Redworms are the only live bait allowed when fishing the pond and that use is limited to children under the age of 13. Nightcrawlers or pieces of nightcrawlers are prohibited
- The use of barbless hooks is highly encouraged but not currently manda-tory
- Do not introduce any fish, reptiles, birds, etc. of any kind to the pond
- Use of any watercraft is prohibited
- Swimming and ice skating is prohibited
