We will enjoy a simple meal followed by conversation around themes found in Kate Bowler's Lenten devotional, *The Hardest Part: Hurt We Carry, Hope We Find.* Choir will follow at 7 pm.

AMOS (A Mid-Iowa Organizing Strategy) is an organization of institutions working together to make our community a place that works for everyone. First Baptist is one of 37 institutional members of AMOS and one of 9 members in Ames. This year our Ames cluster is focusing on housing needs in our community. Civic Academies are being held this spring – opportunities to learn about housing in our community as well as have conversations and share stories and personal experiences around housing. (This will be much like the House Meetings we have held in the past, along with a teaching/learning component.)
