### Grace Through Faith By Wade Anderson

"For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith -" (Ephesians 2:8) "For the grace of God that bringeth salvation hath appeared to ALL men." (Titus 2:11) These are two foundational Scriptures that show it doesn't matter who we use to be or what we think we did wrong God's grace has been made (past tense) available to EVERYONE by faith. As we continue on we'll see our works separate from faith are worthless.

I want to begin here by saying, if you have already asked Jesus to be the Lord of your life you have got to stop thinking and saying, "I'm just an ole sinner saved by grace." You are no longer an ole sinner! *First Peter 1:23* tells us, *"Having been born again, NOT of corruptible seed but incorruptible, through the Word of God which lives and abides forever ..."* Let's see what this means?

Let's pray: Gracious and Almighty heavenly Father, as I stand here today and always in Your presence I invite Your Holy Spirit to be the teacher. Jesus You said that the same Spirit that raised You from the dead NOW lives inside of each and every one of us, to teach us, to train us, to correct us and even tell us of things to come. Today we open our hearts, prepared and ready to receive the TRUTH that is in Your Word. As we bind Your Word around us and allow Your Spirit to teach us, today Lord, I declare that many will begin to be loosed from the chains of legalism and religious bondage! I ask that everything that is NOT of You here in this message be washed away in the precious blood of Your Son, Christ Jesus. Wash us in Your Word Lord that our lives begin to bear the evidence of Your presence to those around us, for Your glory Lord. Teach us who we truly are in Your sight. Amen and Amen!

When we ALL were born into this world it was through the seed of our earthly parents. The KJV and NKJV use the term 'corruptible seed' where other translations of the Bible use the phrase 'perishable seed'. The one thing that is inevitable amongst every person born into this world is ... we all will one day perish/die. The Scripture above (and many, many more) share with us a way to have eternal life, after our life here on this earth.

Can you remember anywhere in the Bible where childbirth had manifest without two human beings? I know you can. The only place I can find is when Mary gave birth to her son, our Savior, Jesus. God had given the angel Gabriel this message to take to Mary, "You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you will call Him Jesus." (Luke 1:31) Of course we all can relate to Mary's confusion since she had never yet slept with a man. Confused but not doubtful Mary asked, "How will this be since I am a virgin?"(Luke 1:34) In Luke 1:35 the angel answered Mary and said, "The Holy Spirit will come on you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy One to be born will be called the Son of God." We can see here that Joseph had absolutely nothing to do with Mary conceiving Jesus. Every other person EVER born came and will always come the natural way, and in that sense under the curse of Adam. However, Jesus was born of the supernatural Holy Spirit. God does NOT want even one of us to remain under that curse. (Romans 5:12-14)

The Word of God always affirms itself through multiple Scriptures so let's look again at **1 Peter 1:23**, where it says, "Through the (Word of God) which lives and abides forever." (parenthesis are mine)

Israel believed they were the only ones to be God's chosen people but their hearts had grown hard towards God throughout time so He gave Isaiah this word of prophesy. In Isaiah 65:9 we read, "I will bring forth descendents from Jacob, and from Judah those who will possess My mountains; My chosen people will inherit them, and there will My servants live." This is a prophecy of Salvation through Jesus! In order to see this prophesy being fulfilled turn over to Luke 3:23-37. Luke recorded Jesus' ancestors from Adam to Joseph, specifically in verses 33-34, "The son of Judah, the son of Jacob." Isn't that what we just read in Isaiah 65:9? Maybe you think there is a contradiction now in Scripture because Joseph is listed in Jesus' genealogy. Let me show you real quickly how that is cleared up. In Luke 3:23b it is real clear, "He (Jesus) was the son, SO IT WAS THOUGHT, of Joseph." 'People' knew that Mary was with Joseph so they assumed that this child Mary was carrying was his. After all, natural child birth was all the world knew until Jesus came. Let me assure you, the Bible NEVER contradicts itself it's simply our own lack of understanding. Look above where I mentioned the parenthesis are mine. Watch closely as Scripture sheds light on that phrase (Word of God). John truly had a revelation of who Jesus was ... listen, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through Him all things were made; without Him nothing was made that has been made. In Him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it ... The Word became flesh and made His dwelling amongst us. We have seen His glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, FULL OF GRACE AND TRUTH." (John 1:1-5, 14)

It may seem like I am bouncing all over the place but stay with me and allow the Holy Spirit to minister these truths as we continue. I want you all to see clearly through the Bible, that Grace IS the Person of Jesus Christ and by faith in His finished work and God's faithfulness God NOW sees you as righteous! As we look back at the prophesy God gave Isaiah in *Isaiah 65:1*, God said, *"I revealed Myself to those who did not ask of Me; I was found by those who did not seek* 

Me. To a nation that did not call on My name, I said, 'Here am I, here am I.'" What God was saying here was, "If you Israelites, the very ones I have called to be My own people, won't receive and believe Me I'll go to the Gentile nations!" (my paraphrase) Listen as the Apostle Paul speaks of this grafting 'IN' that Isaiah prophesied. "For we are God's handiwork, created IN Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do. THEREFORE, remember that formerly you who are Gentiles by birth and called 'uncircumcised' by those who call themselves 'the circumcision' (which is done in the body by human hands) - remember that at that time you were separate from Christ, excluded from the citizenship in Israel and foreigners to the covenants of the promise, without hope and without God IN THE WORLD. BUT now IN CHRIST JESUS you who were once far away have been brought near BY THE BLOOD OF CHRIST." (Romans 2:10-13) WOW! Can you begin to see that God has always had a plan? God Has ALREADY provided It All, for every single one of us!!

Instead of an 'ole sinner saved by grace' everything in Scripture is telling us, "You are NOW the righteousness of God IN CHRIST JESUS!" (2 Corinthians 5:21) Sometimes we mope around wondering why things always seem to be coming against us. We wonder why we aren't seeing the kind of fruit in our lives that Jesus talks about. Let me encourage you to stop and listen to the words that you allow to cross your lips. Listen here how the New American Standard Bible (NASB) reads in Proverbs 18:20-21, "With the fruit of a man's mouth his stomach will be satisfied; He will be satisfied with the product of his lips. Death and life are in the power of the tongue, and those who love it will eat its fruit." In other words, the fruit you are experiencing in your life could be a direct result of what you are speaking. Let me encourage everyone to also go back and reread James 3:9-12. Read Romans chapters 1-7 and then ask yourselves, "Do my words line up with who God's Word says I am IN CHRIST JESUS? I truly believe that every time we confess "I am the righteousness of God in Christ" it pleases God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit. Every time we confess "I am the righteousness of God in Christ" it lets God know that we are grateful that He has declared us righteous, that we acknowledge and accept His sacrifice when He gave us His one and only Son. (John 3:16, Romans 3:26) Every time Jesus hears us confess "I am the righteousness of God in Christ" I'm sure it fills His heart with joy, because He knows we are now getting a hold of what He suffered and died to supply for us. The Holy Spirit's job is to convict us of unrighteousness. (John 16:5-10) So, I also believe that every time we confess "I am the righteousness of God in Christ" the Holy Spirit smiles and says. "You are listening and hearing Me, keep coming this way." To put it simply, righteous/righteousness means that God has declared us in right standing with Him when we believe, by faith, what He has provided through the finished work of Jesus at the Cross. That right there should make us ALL stand up and shout HALLELUJAH!

I want to continue on a little further with righteous/righteousness from Romans 3:19-25 so hang on. "Now we know that whatever the Law (written on stone tablets) says, it says to those who are under the Law (Jews), so that every mouth may be silenced and the whole world held accountable to God. Therefore NO ONE will be declared righteous in God's sight by the 'works' of the Law; rather, through the Law we become conscious of our sin. BUT NOW apart from the Law the righteousness of God has been made known, to which the Law and the Prophets testify. THIS RIGHTEOUSNESS IS GIVEN THROUGH FAITH IN JESUS CHRIST TO ALL WHO BELIEVE. There is no difference between Jew and Gentile, for ALL have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and ALL are justified freely by His grace through the redemption that came BY Christ Jesus. God presented Christ as a sacrifice of atonement, through the shedding of His blood - to be received BY FAITH. He did this to demonstrate His righteousness." (parenthesis are mine) Brothers and sisters I'm NOT saying that God loves sin in any shape, size or fashion. But do you see that God is NOT mad at any of us anymore. His love is NOT based on our performance. We just read that God made us righteous in His sight by the sacrifice of Jesus at the Cross through our faith. Since God sees us through the blood of Jesus He obviously isn't even in a bad mood. Praise Jesus! (1John 4:10, 1 Thessalonians 5:9, 2 Corinthians 5:21)

We were all lost and in a messy worldly way at one point in our lives but, *Ephesians 2:4-6a* (NKJV) tells us, "*But God, who is rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, even when we were dead in trespasses, made us alive together with Christ* (by grace you have been saved), *and raised us up together, and made us sit together in the heavenly places IN CHRIST JESUS ...* "Brothers and sisters there is so much to look at in just these few verses of Scripture. Paul begins here by assuring us that God is rich in mercy. Then he goes on to let us all know that with His great love God loved us EVEN when we were a mess and lost in sin. Now watch this, the very second we received Jesus as Lord of our lives God made us alive IN Christ and seated us in heavenly places. Praise Jesus!

We are NOT saved by grace alone. True, we would NEVER have the life we do have, in Christ, with God, if Jesus hadn't walked in obedience to become the spotless Sacrifice to obtain and redeem us from the mess we were in. Listen deeply to what is written here in 1 Peter 1:18-19 (NLT), "For you know that God paid a ransom to save you from the empty life you inherited from your ancestors. And the ransom He paid was NOT mere gold or silver. He paid for you with the precious lifeblood of Christ, the sinless, spotless Lamb of God." Look now at Ephesians 2:8-9, "For by grace you have been saved THROUGH faith, and that not of yourselves; it is a gift of God, NOT OF WORKS, lest anyone

### Prayer Requests

Please add me to your prayer list. I have been here at this location since September of 2014, suffering from a stroke and then falling face down on the floor. They rushed me to

the hospital and during that same time I also needed a replacement pacemaker. After the surgery in July of 2015 I found out that the surgeon said the old pacemaker was dislodged so he left it inside of me. This has caused a very bad infection to this date. It is to the point that they cannot overpower the infection with the best medications that they have ... I also just found out that my daughter was killed in a car accident. This is the second daughter that I have lost in two years. This has taken so much out of me. I am 72 years old. My children are suppose to outlive me. I know there is power in prayer, unity and agreement ... **A.B.** 

I applied for work release a month and a half back and about three weeks back, I got a blister on my right big toe. I was breaking in a new pair of shoes. The blister would not heal and it turned into an infection. I was put on a low grade, cheap antibiotic that did little good. I ended up in an outside hospital and the infection had entered into the bone just behind the toe nail. The surgeon told me if he could, he would scrape the infection off the bone but if it is in the bone he would take it off as far back as the good bone. I was extremely scared and unable to contact my family for prayers and support. I was able to get a hold of the hospital chaplain and received prayer. I knew God was with me but I was still scared. I lost half the toe and with my diabetes healing is slow. It is still trying to heal. I have also been on a medical hold for getting work release. I need prayers for quick healing and being able to get into work release. I know I've put everything in God's hands. Psalm 118:13-14, "I was pushed back and about to fall, but the Lord helped me. The Lord is my strength and my defense, He has become my Salvation." I praise Him every day and thank Him for all He has done for me and all that HE is doing for me ... B.B.

I would like to submit a prayer request. Please pray that I have a smooth transition from prison to the half-way house. Also that when I get out I will be able to find a good Bible teaching church. I will be released no later than September ... J.L.

I'm coming up on one year for my appeal and haven't heard anything yet. Keep this in your prayers if you don't mind. I hope that this will bring me home soon as I'm really excited to see and meet all of you very soon ... S.F.

I do appreciate it and the time and expense it takes to share the encouragement of Christ with us prisoners. He gives more grace. (James 4:6) Praise God for His true peace. I just wanted to let you know of my change of address, I'm now at a minimum custody level ... Praise God. Possibly getting to pre-release soon after 16 1/2 years of high security prison, it is a blessing

to be moving forward by God's grace. I just got to continue to grow in Christ, not to get caught up in the world, but to grow in sanctification, to live for Christ by the power of His might. So, may God's grace, peace, mercy and blessings be with you and yours, to be uplifted and comforted in Christ. Praise God for His saving love ... **D.C.** 

THIS IS HUGE! This unit is the only unit in the state that has a computer lab via Eastern Arizona College that offers an Associate's degree ... I know, huh?! But one better than that is I'M GOING TO COLLEGE BROTHER!! PRAISE GOD!!! EAC does not care if you are a lifer or not, you can still go to school. I'm not sure what the A.A. is in but who cares, I think business? I suppose I should find out, huh? Anyhow, I started today! ### The Builder Contributed by S.F.

An elderly carpenter was ready to retire. He told his employer/contractor, of his plans to leave the house building business and live a more leisurely life with his wife, enjoying his extended family. He would miss the paycheck, but he needed to retire. They could get by.

The contractor was sorry to see his good worker go and asked if he could build just one more house as a personal favor. The carpenter said, "Yes," but in time it was easy to see that his heart was not in his work. He resorted to shoddy workmanship and used inferior materials. It was an unfortunate way to end his career. Your life today is a result of your attitudes and choices in the past. Your life tomorrow will be the result of your attitude and the choices you make today.

### Cast Your Burdens on the Lord C.S.

I've got to be forthcoming. I am a sex offender, and so far I have been knocked out and beaten up. I try hard every day not to let my emotions overwhelm me. I realize that God does not prevent you from acting foolishly, but He does allow you to experience the consequences of your foolishness. So when I got beat up I looked at it as a test to see how I would handle the problem. After all, character is strengthened not through ease but through adversity.

I have some questions ... There are times when I ask myself what was my purpose in life? Surely it wasn't to have done this shameful thing that I have done. I don't understand. I do know that when life has meaning one can bear almost anything, without it nothing is bearable. There are times when I wonder, with all of the changes going on in my life, how can I keep it all together? How can I find contentment, regardless of life's circumstances in a place like this? What do you do when you are being measured up to others? What do you do when people murmur against you?

People judge, resent and reject me in here AND out there. I believe that God has already judged my sin for what it was and that is why I am here. Sin is sin and my actions were wrong no matter what caused them. I know I am never going to find peace within myself until I have taken responsibility for who I am and who I have become.

I am aware that the devil wants for me to remain broken inside so that I cannot handle the problems in my life. But the Word of God says, "Cast your burdens on the Lord" and He will sustain you. I live with this guilt and shame every day and these four walls in my cell remind me why I am here. I need to find self forgiveness for myself so I can move forward and not let the past control my future. Please pray for my continued spiritual guidance.

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## Foot's Bible Study Rotes

### 1 Chronicles 12:19-16:36

People are often drawn to a great cause and the brave, determined people who support it. As believers, we have the greatest cause ... the Salvation of people. If we are brave, determined, and faithful, others will be drawn to work with us. (12:22)

Often the soldiers wanted to keep souvenirs from the battle. In **2** Samuel 5:21 it states that some of the men kept some of these idols. But David ordered them to burn the idols. The only proper response to sin is to get rid of it completely. You cannot be a follower of God while continuing to hold on to parts of your life where God is not the center of your thoughts and actions. Eliminate whatever takes God's rightful place in your life, and follow Him with complete devotion. (14:12)

Beginning any task by praising God can inspire us to give Him our best. Develop the practice of giving praise to God, and you will experience greater joy and strength to face anything. (15:16-25)

The basis of praise is declaring God's character and attributes in the presence of others. When we recognize and affirm His goodness, we are holding up His perfect moral nature for all to see. Praise benefits us because it takes our mind off our problems and needs, and focuses on God's power, mercy, majesty and love. (16:25)

### Romans 1:1-32

When you pray continually about a concern, don't be surprised at how God answers. Paul prayed to visit Rome so he could teach the Christians there. When he finally arrived in Rome, it was as a prisoner. (Acts 28:16) Paul prayed for a safe trip, and he did arrive safely, after getting arrested, slapped in the face, ship-wrecked, and bitten by a poisonous snake. God's ways of answering our prayers are often far from what we expect. When we sincerely pray, God will answer, although in His timing and sometimes in ways we do not expect. (1:9-10)

Does anyone have an excuse for not believing in God? The Bible answers an emphatic, "No." God has revealed what He is like, through His creation. Every person, therefore, either accepts or rejects God. Don't be fooled. When the day comes for God to judge your response to Him, no excuses will be accepted. Begin today to give your devotion and worship to Him. (1:18-20)

### Psalm 9:13-10:15

The world may ignore the plight of the needy, crushing any earthly hope they may have. But God, the Champion of the weak, promises that this will not be the case forever. Wicked nations, which forget the Lord and refuse to help their people, will be judged by God. He knows our needs, He knows our tendency to despair, and He has promised to care for us. (See also 9:9-12) Even when others forget us, He will remember. (9:18)

There is an incompatibility between blind arrogance and the presence of God in our hearts. The proud person depends on himself rather than on God. This causes God's guiding influences to leave his life. When God's presence is welcome, there is no room for pride because He makes us aware of our true selves. (10:11)

### Proverbs 19:4-7

This Proverb speaks of the effects of wealth and poverty on friendship. It does not describe how friends ought to behave, but how many friends actually do. Like a faithful spouse, a faithful friend is priceless. (19:4)

The behavior of brothers and friends who abandon a friend because of poverty should be contrasted with the true friend in such texts as *Proverbs* 17:14 and 18:24. (19:7)

# "Foot" Notes

Hello again and blessings to you all. I've been inspired by some reading I've been doing and wanted to share it with you all. How many of us are struggling with or have struggled with forgiveness? We all at one time or another have said plenty of foul things about or to someone who has hurt us either mentally, physically or emotionally. Which would lead to forgiveness being a non-issue, as in 'it ain't happening'! In my opinion, I believe that even before we can forgive others we need to clean our own slate. We need to NOT beat ourselves down over our own mistakes/ sins. In doing so this will open US up to moving forward with forgiving others. I think that the more we can learn to forgive the more we can clean our own slate so to speak. Religion teaches that we must 'do' this, this and that in order for God to love us and if we stumble and fall on 'that' journey ... well, we have to 'work' our way back into His presence to see if He will still love us. NO!! That IS NOT what these Scriptures above tell us. It said, "Even when we were dead in our trespasses ... God paid a ransom to save you ... it is a GIFT of God." God paid the ransom ONCE for every single persons sins (Hebrews 9:28) who has lived and will ever live on the face of this earth, and it was (past tense) paid in full over 2,000 years ago, "With the precious lifeblood of Christ." ### In Search of a Church Home

As you can see by the envelope I'm writing you all from prison. One of my friends here, Art, helps with the church here and he gets newsletters from the Overcomers for Ofrist. Last Sunday when I went to church, I read the part on the back of one of your newsletters titled All About You by R.S. and liked it. Then when I seen the front I liked it even more. That caused me to ask him if the church itself had a church branch in Tucson. When I get out I want to continue going to church where I will feel at home, with people that will accept me riding a motorcycle to church fresh out of prison. I am giving up a lot of my old ways, but I don't think I can ever give up riding bikes.

I have pretty much lost everything and everyone that I had out there. None of my family will talk to me anymore, but I guess I did this to myself by coming right back to prison. I'm not whining, but my mom and sister live in California and won't write me. In fact, I don't even know if they know that I'm here again. Most of my other family dislikes me because I have been in trouble most of my life. I guess when I started doing good, it was already too late.

My first arrest was when I was 9 years old. I got married almost 14 years ago. I have four kids and I now also have some grandkids. My getting in trouble with the law slowed down some when I got married. My wife and kids made me want to change, but I didn't have God in my life then like I do now. My mom and my wife used to always tell me I was working on going back to prison or dying but I never listened to them. In hindsight I should have, look where I'm sitting today.

I used to take cars and then scrap them. One day this guy offered me a job and I took it, that was twelve years ago. I worked so much and so hard that I quit taking cars and ended up running the company for the owner. I guess he saw something in me that no one else seen. He trusted me with everything he had. He was heavy in to church and always tried to get me to go with him but I always thought I was too bad to go to church ... and what would my friends think. Funny thing is, now, I'm in prison with no friends EXCEPT the friends I go to church with. I feel bad that I let my boss down, he was like a father to me. He always treated me great and helped me whenever I needed anything. I finally had a good life with more than I needed. Then it all started to unwind ...

I started taking time off of work to take my wife on 3-5 day motorcycle rides everywhere. One day, I was at my house after work drinking a beer and had smoked a little pot while I was working on my motorcycle. When I turned around there was this guy, he had a gun in my face right in my own driveway and I lost it. That quick I went right back to my old ways. I ran inside to get my gun and by the time I got back he was gone. Then I started smoking Meth. I did this everyday so I could stay awake and find him after work. As that progressed, I started staying at work because my wife wanted me to stop what I was doing before I got myself killed or killed someone else.

Finally one day the cops saved me from myself. When they pulled me over they found my shotgun in my trunk box. When I went to court they seen that I was doing great before this incident and decided to put me on probation instead of six years in D.O.C. With this break I started doing good again. I was working, doing my probation the way they wanted me to and paying my fines. I was even back at home with my wife and kids. Right then my wife got real sick and ended up in the hospital, almost dying. I was there with her when my P.O. called and wanted to know why I wasn't at work. When I told him my wife was in the hospital and I was there with her he told me that I was violating my probation and he wanted me to come see him. I told him I wasn't leaving my wife! So he issued a warrant for my arrest. I later got picked up by the U.S. Marshals and went back to prison for nine months.

When I was released I went right back to work for my same old boss and fixing bikes on the side. Someone came to me with a wrecked bike to fix and I spent three weeks getting it done. That day I took it up to get gas and ride it a little when ... you guessed it, I was pulled over. The cops said the bike was stolen. I was only out of prison for five months and doing so well, I thought, and only 36 days of parole left. I was arrested for being in possession of a stolen motorcycle while on parole. This time when I went to court it didn't look so good for me. They brought up all of my priors and wanted to give me 8 1/2 - 16 1/2 years.

Once again my wife and family left me. I gave up everything including my freedom. At that moment I stopped fighting my case and gave my life to God and let Him take over. I was going to trial and was looking at twelve years flat. Then out of the blue they came at me with a plea agreement for 3 1/2 years! I signed! After that I really trust God with my life, and I only wished I had trusted Him sooner. Even though I have had a lot of hard times here in prison God has been right here with me.

When I do get out this time I don't know where I am going or what I will do but I know that God has a plan for me and He will let me know what it is when the time is right. It's true I have to start all over again, but this time I know I need to find a good church to go to and stay away from my old ways. I would love to learn everything I can about God. - **R.S.**
