Deb Werner read the minutes of the club's March 2020 meeting. Vito Zavagli moved to approve, seconded by Dave Lantz; approved.

Duane Bunton read the treasurer's report. Vito Zavagli moved to approve, seconded by Craig Sheridan; approved.

Old Business: Steve Kindell said the planned April events have all been cancelled due to the Covid-19 virus pandemic.

New Business: no New Business at this time.Little Hershey: Dave Lantz said advertising deadlines for Little Hershey are not until end of April. Dave also said \$900 has been collected so far from vendors and also said there were 90 vendors last year. He also noted that there are some contract issues with Boone County Fairgrounds. Wayne Orrison made a motion that Little Hershey 2020 be cancelled, seconded by Wayne Henson, each officer and board member and club members present at the meeting stated approval to cancel; approved. Dave said he will contact Little Hershey vendors and others concerning cancellation of the event. Wayne Orrison stated club members need to think about possible future events ideas due to the loss of the revenue of the cancelled Little Hershey event. He said he will make mention of this in the April newsletter.
