



Crockpot Christmas Crack

16 oz. unsalted Planters dry peanuts

16 oz. salted Planters peanuts

12 oz. semi-sweet chocolate chips

12 oz. milk chocolate chips

10 oz. peanut butter chips

1 lb. white almond bark

Layer all ingredients in a large crockpot. Put on low. Cover with lid and leave for 2 hours. Remove the lied and stir to combine. Replace lid and leave for 30 minutes. Stir again. Then spoon mixture onto wax paper or non-stick aluminum foil. Hardens in 1 hour.



Quick Chicken Pot Pie

2 Lg. cans chicken

Giving Cheerfully

In the Old Testament, the people knew what God expected them to give because He commanded the people to tithe, which required the people to give one-tenth of their harvest or produce (income) to the Lord. As New Covenant Christians, we have the freedom to decide what to give, but we are expected to give cheerfully. "Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Corinthians 9:7). Giving is not to be based strictly by the percentage we give to the Lord but by the largeness of our hearts toward God. God appreciates bighearted people who give their money to Him cheerfully. It's not always easy to give cheerfully, because we need to spend money on rent or mortgages, food, and clothing, and we would like to take some nice family vacations or drive newer calls, etc. It is tempting to scrimp on generosity or to give with a frown.

Our human spirit has been profoundly twisted by Adam's sin, and this present world is a hard place to live. There is only one way that we can rise above those circumstances to live a new life where generous and cheerful giving is the norm and not the exception. In order for us to do this, we must have a personal faith relationship with Jesus Christ and day after day tap into God's rich supply of life-changing grace. The only power that can consistently overcome the sin nature that still clings to each of us is the cross of Jesus Christ.

The Apostle Paul declared this Gospel truth in Galatians 2:20. He emphasized, "I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me." If we believe in Jesus as our Savior and Lord, then our sinful flesh has been nailed to the cross with Christ, and the self-absorbed and fearful human ego no longer has any right or power to direct how we as Christians live. We can take this truth and apply it to the way we give. Through faith, we are empowered to withstand our flesh and the world who wants us to spend more of our money on things of this world and to give less to God. When we place our trust in God, we can honor Him by giving cheerfully.

As new covenant Christians, we give under grace so we are free to decide in our hearts and minds how much to give. Cheerful givers experience giving as a privilege. Giving changes from a "got to" give to a "want to" give. Cheerful giving comes from new hearts that God through His Holy Spirit has changed. Giving is to be inspired and voluntary, not an obligation or only out of necessity or possible recognition. Giving is an outward expression based on an inner conviction. Through faith, we understand that we are God's instruments through whom He works to help people in need, to support His Church, and to extend His kingdom. May God find us willing and cheerful to use our time and money to do His work.



From Pastor's Desk...

In June I wrote a newsletter article about what makes Trinity Lutheran and LCMS Lutherans unique in our teaching and practice. In this article I want to focus specifically on the Lord's mission in this place. And, specifically, how God's Word and Sacrament fill our lives with a yearning to share that Word and life with those around us.

Global Mission

The LCMS has sent of 200 missionaries across the globe. Working together with 35 partner churches which share the same confession of faith, the LCMS sends missionaries, not only to unserved areas, but also to support a global network of churches.

One of the biggest supporters of this work is Mission Central in Mapleton, IA. Millions of dollars are raised annually to fund our global missionaries.

Iowa Mission

Mission work is happening throughout Iowa District West (there are two LCMS districts in Iowa; a district is a geographical area in which the church works together to carry out the Lord's work).

Immigrant/Ethic Ministries: Currently, the LCMS has a missionary to the Hispanic people, Rev. Pedro Lopez. Mission work is done among the African immigrant people in West Des Moines, Ankeny, and even among the Sudanese in LeMars.

Campus Ministry: Work is done at Iowa State, Drake, and other colleges in western Iowa.

Work is also done in local congregations through Swaddling clothes, food banks, English as a Second Language classes, David's Harp, which raises up new church musicians, and many more.

Trinity Mission

Divine Service is where God's mission of saving us is made real "for you." Jesus gives faith, forgives sins, and equips us for life in the world to live by faith as God's children.

Home: You carry the work done in the Divine Service home. Through Scripture reading, prayer, meal times prayer, moral instruction you are equipping your families to live as Christians in a fallen world.

Sunday School for youth and adults teaches us God's Word to give and strengthen faith and ensures we learn God's Word. It should only supplement work done at home.

Catechism is the formal training for livelong learning and preparation to receive the Lord's Supper.

We also support two missionaries sent to carry the Gospel to the world.

God is at work here and for that we are grateful. He calls us to continue this work and there is much more work to do. He's going to use you to do it.


