The Bear Facts

Printed as a public service to gun and bow hunters everywhere by the Fred Bear Sports Club, Grayling, Michigan.

The Friends of Animals, The Humane Society of the United States (not to be confused with your local Humane Society that does such a fine job) and others are making a well-financed concerted attempt to end the sport of hunting in America today. They are using emotional appeals to the public supported by Disney-type attitudes of what life in the wild is like completely overlooking death by starvation, predator, fang and claw. They are overlooking the fact that you, the hunters of America, are the greatest protectors of wildlife, both sport and non-sport species, that the world has ever known. Carry this card with you. It contains pertinent facts that you can use to tell the hunters' side of the story.

☛ The \$108,000,000 spent each year for hunting licenses goes to state game departments to support wildlife and conservation in all 50 states according to the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service (This includes game as well as non-game species).

☛ \$472,000,000 has been collected for conservation since 1937 from the federal excise tax on sporting arms and ammunition. A similar 11% tax has been signed by President Nixon, will cover all archery related sales, and will go into effect in 1974. (National Shooting Sports Foundation)

☛ Almost \$8,000,000 is spent each year on federal duck stamps. (NSSF).

☛ America's hunters have paid in over \$2.2 BILLION into conservation coffers in the past 50 years. (NSSF).

☛ Controlled public hunting is allowed in nearly 200 of the country's 325 national wildlife refuges. The Humane Society of the United States is seeking to end this. (The New York Times)

☛ In 1970 alone well over \$31,675,000 in Pittman-Robertson Federal Aid in Wildlife Restoration Act Funds was allocated to the states for wildlife restoration in those areas... and this \$31,675,000 comes directly from America's hunters from the 11% excise tax they pay for guns and ammunition. (Winchester-Western)

☛ In 1887, the year the Bison vanished from America, there were no whitetailed deer left in Pennsylvania; and by 1900 there were only 500,000 deer left in all the United States. Elk had dwindled from 10 Million animals to less than 50,000 in scattered pockets in several western states. By 1908 there were less than 25,000 pronghorn antelope in North America. Between 1885 and 1910 our original big game supplies had faded by more than 80%! As a result of proper game management initiated by President Teddy Roosevelt of the Boone & Crocket Club and other farsighted men, those 50,000 elk have now grown to 250,000. In one recent year over 80,000 elk were harvested. Those 25,000 antelope now stand at 175,000 with over 50,000 taken by hunters each year. Perhaps most dramatically, that small group of 500,000 deer has grown to 9,000,000 whitetails and another 1,500,000 mule deer. The annual harvest of deer is over 2,000,000. (Winchester-Western) During the last two decades the deer population in the south has increased by 800%. And since 1920 deer populations in the National Forests have increased fivefold according to the Department of Interior's Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife.

☛ The National Safety Council reports a 7.4% decrease in hunting accidents in the past decade. The Metropolitan Life Insurance Company points out that hunting is safer than swimming or fishing. (N.R.A.)

☛ Wildlife habitat is being destroyed at the rate of 3500 acres a day to provide more room for humans. About 34,000,000 acres of rural land will disappear by the year 2000. (National Wildlife Federation) Now more than ever before the hunter must be depended upon to reduce game species in these areas before nature moves in with her cropping tools of starvation and predation.

☛ One out of every 15 hunters in America today is a bowhunter. There are 15,000,000 licensed hunters and 1,250,000 licensed bowhunters. (Wildlife Management Institute)

☛ There are now nearly 8,000,000 archers in America today, approximately the same number as there are golfers.

☛ Archery is now an Official Gold Medal Olympic Sport and in 1972 in Munich, the United States won both the Men's and Women's Gold Medals.

☛ Archery is one of the sports in the President's Council on Physical Fitness Program and is a Lifetime Sport. It knows no age limits.

- A. Helpless in or because of deep snow.
- B. Helpless in water.
- C. Helpless on ice.
- D. Helpless in trap.
- E. While confined behind inescapable fences, as on game farms, etc.
- F. In defiance of game laws or out of season.
- G. By "Jack Lighting" or shining at night.
- H. From power vehicle or power boat.
- I. Any other method considered unsportsmanlike by the directors of The Fred Bear Sports Club.

Fred Bear, the man.

Last summer, during the week of the PAA Nationals the Tournament of Champions and the Olympic Qualifying Tournament the Archery Hall

of Fame was introduced.

The first inductees for this honor were Howard Hill, Ben Pearson, Ann Weber Hoyt, Maurice Thompson, Russ Hoogerhyde, Karl Palmatier and Fred Bear.

Fred's plaque reads "His pioneer work in the art of archery manufacture is matched only by his worldwide contributions to the art of bowhunting."

Behind this one sentence describing the life of a man is a Horatio Alger story worthy of others the likes of Henry Ford, Thomas Edison, George Westinghouse, and other pioneers of the American scene. This is not a biography, it is a commercial catalog, but to understand the quality and craftsmanship built into each and every Bear Archery product, one must first understand the man who insists upon this quality and establishes this craftsmanship. His great devotion to detail has earned Bear products the highest accolades the world over. It was instilled in him by his parents on their farm in Pennsylvania. Even as a youngster running a trap line to earn pocket money Fred would take his hard earned dollars



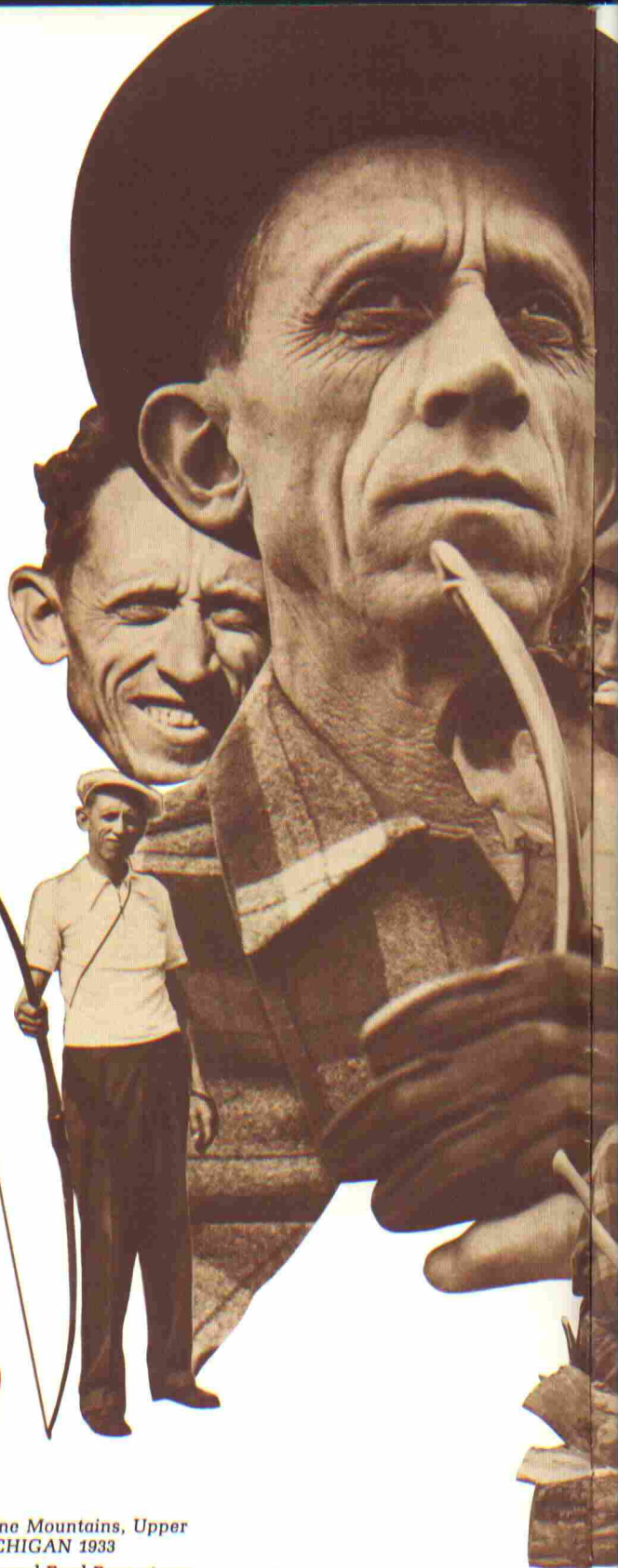
home to his room and iron them so that they would be neat and in proper order. This same attitude was carried over to the extremely critical eye that patternmaker Fred Bear brought to Detroit in the 20's. He was attracted to the almost virgin hunting territories of northern Michigan as well as the automotive industries of that state. In 1927 he saw a movie made by the late Art Young (of Pope & Young) on bowhunting in Alaska and was immediately intrigued. Fred Bear, the patternmaker turned Fred Bear, the bowyer. His first bow was made of Lemonwood. And he taught

himself to shoot it, so well, in fact that in the 30's he made a name for himself in both indoor and outdoor archery tournaments across the state of Michigan. In 1933 he started making equipment for his friends in his home in Detroit and began his lifelong effort to bring archery back into prominence in the world of sports. Since the 1906 Olympics, it had fallen into hard times

with few participants. Fred was instrumental in having the first bowhunting season established in Michigan in 1937. Along with his love of tournament archery grew his thrill of the challenge of hunting with the bow and arrow. He had taken the biggest buck he had ever downed to that time with a rifle and found it to be too easy. He accepted the challenge of the relatively short range of the bow where most shots are usually less than 40 yards and where great hunting





midnight horseback ride mixed in with high spirits and high jinxes, Fred selected the site for his factory on the banks of the beautiful Au Sable river on the edge of the tiny village of Grayling.

Fred Bear is truly a pioneer. He is directly responsible for the development of many of the designs and manufacturing processes utilized by virtually all present-day makers of high quality archery equipment. Moreover, it was his creativity and determination that made possible the mass production of bows and arrows. His patents, covering both methods and materials, have in one way or another benefited almost all of today's bow makers because he has never sought royalties from competing firms. Rather, he has always maintained that what was good for the industry as a whole would be good for his business as well. A dramatic

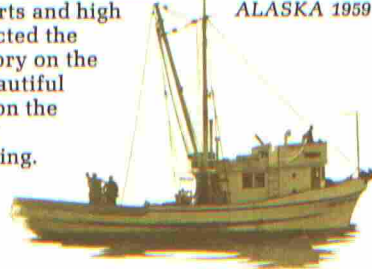
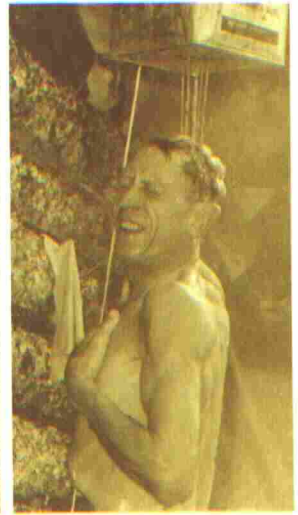
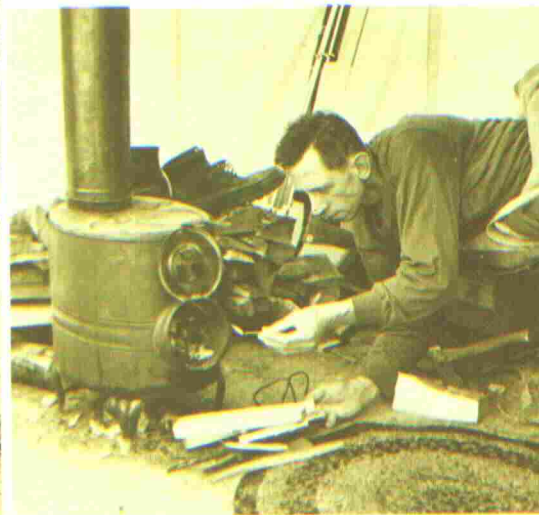


illustration of the meaningful attitude he held toward his patents is the modern composite bow. Fred holds patents covering design, materials, and manufacturing methods relating to this type bow. The fruits of such creative labors have been shared freely. Just a few of Fred Bear's firsts are:

1. First use of high compression materials in bowmaking. Since the middle ages men had searched for materials to duplicate the power and reliability of the ancient Turkish bows whose bowyers had taken their secret to the grave with them. Fred Bear found it by combining fiberglass and exotic hardwoods.
2. First bowsights to become an integral part of a bow's design.
3. First built-in, adjustable arrow plate.

skills must be developed to get within that range. Much of Fred's early bow hunting was done in the beautiful Au Sable River valley of the Northern Michigan lower peninsula. And so it was to that area that he decided to move his manufacturing facilities shortly after World War II. He freely admits that it was done to be near the fabulous hunting and fishing found there. After a hilarious

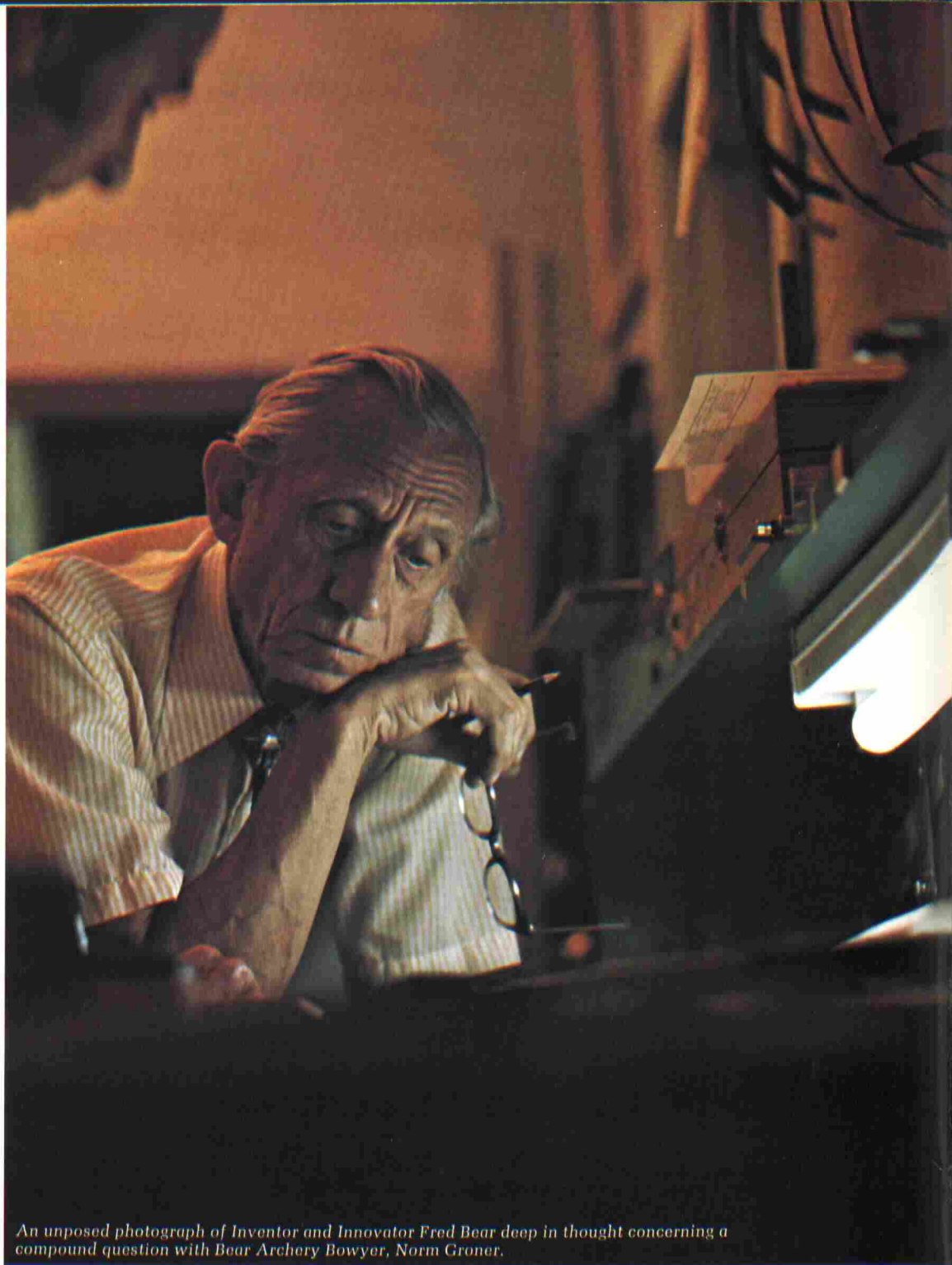


4. Invented the bow quiver as an aid to hunters stalking thru heavy brush. The traditional back or belt quiver is troublesome under normal hunting conditions. Fred discarded his, carrying his arrows first in his hands. Then he struck upon the idea of crafting a groove into the back of his bow handle, a slot into which his spare arrow would fit. Finally he came up with a hand held quiver with which he could maneuver around obstacles. (see page 29). The logical next step was for Fred to attach this quiver directly to the bow with a protective cover for his hunting heads. Thus was born the bow quiver.

5. The Bear Razorhead is the most famous and most used hunting head in the world today. It was developed by Fred to insure bringing the game down as quickly and humanely as possible. Rather than having just two cutting surfaces as have been used since Stone Age man Fred added a replaceable insert into the main blade giving the hunting head four cutting surfaces. This humane effort has been very effective.

6. The truest measure of the creativity brought by a designer to his work is to look at even the simplest item, such as a nail, and be able to improve upon it after careful study of the object, its environment, its limitations and its purpose. Fred studied the arrow. He already had improved the arrowhead but the basic principle of the arrow had remained the same for millenia. The shaft was permanently attached to the arrowhead. The archer needed one arrow for hunting big game, another for field archery and a third for small game and stump shooting. Fred's Answer? The new Converta-Point Arrow. A unique idea permitting the instant removal of one head for the substitution of another. Suddenly one arrow became three arrows. The hunter could use blunts, field points or razorheads all on the same shaft. The 3 in 1 arrow was a reality. A wonder shaft, X-7 aluminum, was added to this revolutionary new head for the resultant ultimate arrow.

7. The way that Fred Bear has helped build the sport of archery from relative obscurity to its current high level of popularity, approximately the same participant level as golf, was by traveling around the world, field testing his many archery inventions and innovations under the most trying and punishing conditions. Fred literally gambled his life many times on his

equipment. He felled a bull elephant with one arrow. He had proven his equipment on all of the major big game animals of the world. But in all of this traveling he had one constant problem. His bow was cumbersome. It was too long and could be easily damaged by careless freight handlers. It is critical to the success of any hunt that the major piece of equipment, the bow, arrive in top shape. So, in 1947, Fred invented a take down bow. But he was not satisfied with it. For while he had invented a solution, he had not perfected it to his extremely high standards. And so, he never put it

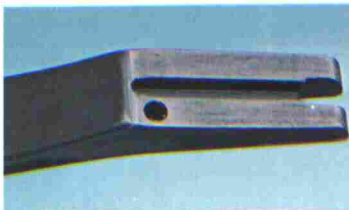
on the market. But he continued to fiddle with it. And to study it. His goal was a true take-down bow, one easy to assemble and take apart like a fine gun, not just a take apart bow requiring tools and time. In the meantime his competitors introduced a take-apart bow, seemingly stealing the thunder from Fred. Still he wouldn't bring out his bow. He is a patient man. And he is a man who will not put his name on a product that does not meet his standards. Finally, in 1967, after twenty years of experimenting, Fred Bear found the ultimate answer to the Take-Down bow. A

bow that could be taken apart quickly and hand carried in a briefcase sized protective covering. But, it would be three more years before Fred permitted his bow to be offered for sale to the public. First, he must test it under the most trying of terrain in the high country of Alaska, the jungle growth in the Amazon and in Africa. It proved its mettle on game of all sizes on these three continents. Fred Bear had invented and perfected the ultimate Take Down bow.

Fred Bear Take-Down Bows

With the Bear Take-Down, you shoot tournaments and trophies with one bow instead of two. Change limbs and you're ready to go from the field to the tournament line.

Just insert perfectly-matched Bear limbs into the handle and they're locked into place for precision shooting. They cannot rattle or move. Machined grooves in the limbs and matching limb microgroove alignment key in the handle's socket hold the limb securely in place for perfect fit and alignment each time. No tools are required. Hardware—latches, yokes, and clamps—is made of steel. Like a fine gun. Shoot trophies in the morning, tournaments in the afternoon—with one bow instead of two. The Bear Take-Down.

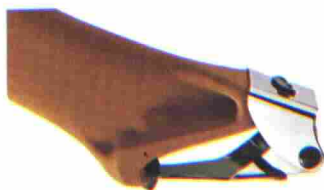

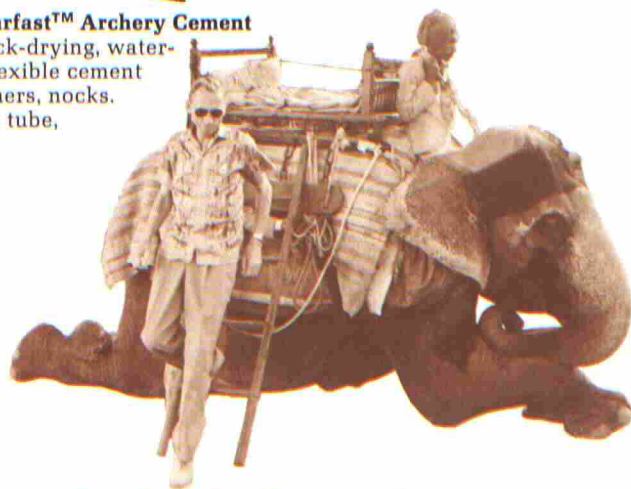

Buying Aids

How to buy what equipment and which accessories? Depends upon what aspect of the sport you're interested in. The items recommended here have been selected personally by Fred Bear. It's good advice.

Arrows: Your arrow must match your bow weight and draw length. The weight is marked on the bow. It's easy to determine draw length (see page 27). Select the best quality arrow you can afford, such as the Bear Converta-Point; the heads are interchangeable.

Aluminum: 1032—field; 1033—blunt

Fiberglass: 1092—field; 1093—blunt

1072—field; 1073—blunt

Cedar: 1042—field; 1043—blunt

Quivers: Most hunters prefer the Cheyenne 3175 for field and hunting practice. Targeteers prefer the 3725 Big Bear back quiver to hold 24 arrows, and it has a roomy zipper pocket. Tournament shooters favor the Tournament belt quiver, 3735, with divider strap and accessory pocket.

Gloves: For field shooting, choose the Master (3380) or the Corfam® Pro-glove (3360). For target and tournament, take the Bear twin tab (3330).

Armguards: An armguard protects your arm from string slap and keeps your sleeves from deflecting your shot. The popular choice of all archers is the ventilated armguard, 3465. Another favorite is the 3490 Pickering, of brushed aluminum, because it's cool and comfortable. If you like a longer armguard to protect above and below the elbow, consider the Hunting Armguard, 3480.

Sights: The best available is the Bear-Jeffery Omni-Bowsight, 6300, for tournament work. The Tournament Handle Sections of the Victor Vikings and the Victor Tartar® bow are factory-drilled to receive this sight. Another good choice is the Bear® Premier sight, 6050. Write our Custom Service Department for installation details on other bows.

How to Tune Your Bow

Two things make you a good archer: your bow and your arrow. Simple, yes, and important, yes. The idea is to match bow and arrow to you. Then you're ready for fun, sport, game.

The Bow

Don't select a bow that requires too much pull for you. Everyone has his limits. Pull your bow, hold it for 10 seconds. If you quiver, that may not be your bow. Don't make it too easy for yourself, either—meaning, too light a pull.

The Bowstring

To measure proper brace height, measure at right angles to the string from the deepest cut in the handle on the bow's face below arrow shelf.

The Arrow

It's easy to select your proper arrow length. Take up your full draw on a special measuring arrow (marked off in inches). Your arrow length stops at that point of the arrow in relation to the front of arrow shelf (illustrated, page 27).

Now match your draw length to your bow weight. For each inch difference in draw length, add or subtract about two pounds of bow weight from the weight marked on your bow (most bows are weighed at 28"). Example: you have a 30" draw. You're shooting with a 36 lb. bow. Your bow weight is actually 40 lbs. Similarly, if yours is a 27" draw, your 36 lb. bow is drawing only 34 lbs.

Now that you know your actual bow weight at draw length, see your Bear dealer and ask to see a top-quality aluminum arrow. Like the Bear-Easton arrow. Select the arrow according to the weight for your sport—in indoor, field, hunting.

The spine is the stiffness of the arrow. An improper spine can put your arrow right or left of target.

Your Bear® dealer can provide you with the best arrow because every box of Bear arrows is factory-marked to indicate spine and length. Correct spine and weight determine arrow speed and trajectory.

Your arrow, then, must match your bow weight and actual draw length. Now you have a matched arrow.

Each Bear shaft is accurately weighted, with the proper wall thickness, and correct spine. In high-quality arrows, the tolerances are precise.

The serious tournament shooter uses the 1010 Bear-Easton aluminum arrow. Intermediate and beginners choose the 1150 Bear Falcon or 1060 cedar arrow.

How to String a Bow Safely

You still see archers using the push-pull or step-through stringing method. Wrong! You can hurt yourself, and you can damage your favorite bow. Instead, the safe and easy way is with the 7850 Three-Bear Bowstringer. Simply stand on the cord after you attach the bowstringer to bow tips. The tips bend as you pull up, ready for easy, safe stringing. You're in good company; this is the bowstringer used by pros. See page 37.

How to sharpen Bear Razorhead®

Razorhead are sharpened before they leave the factory, but be sure to sharpen yours before you hunt. Instructions are included in the package. Use a mill file (3135) or the file in the 3130 Fred Bear Bowhunter's Kit for best results. File toward the point and at the original bevel. Finish by holding file flat on bevel at 90° to arrow shaft. Take five or six light strokes on both sides of the edge to remove the burr. File a rounded chisel point, not a long, slender point, or the arrow will curl if it hits bone.



The Bear Guarantee

When you purchase your bow from an authorized Bear dealer, your purchase is protected. Every Bear bow is numbered and the registration card is yours when you buy it. Fill out and mail within 10 days of purchase.

If the registered bow fails within nine months after date of purchase, Bear Archery repairs it at no cost to you, or replaces the bow if unable to repair. The exceptions are misuse, improper handling, or limb damage caused by improper stringing.

After nine months, and up to 18 months after purchase date, repair or replacement will be made for 1/3 of the purchase price.

After 18 months, and up to 36 months following purchase date, repair or replacement will be at 2/3 of the purchase price.

You must return the bow to us for our inspection. Replacement will be made with a bow of the same model and weight, as closely as possible.

To repeat, the guarantee is valid only when the bow is purchased at an authorized Bear dealer. Dealers are not authorized to make adjustments. **REPLACEMENT IS MADE ONLY BY FACTORY CUSTOMER SERVICE DEPARTMENT.**

This warranty is transferable from one owner to another, provided bow is registered at time of purchase by original owner.

The handle sections of the Bear Take-Down bows are so superior that they carry a full replacement or repair warranty for three years, providing the normal requirements of the Bear guarantee are met.

Take-Down limbs carry the same three-year guarantee as on all Bear bows. Limb replacements must be made in pairs, as each pair is a matched set. Single limbs cannot be supplied.

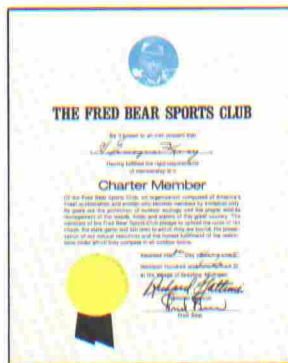

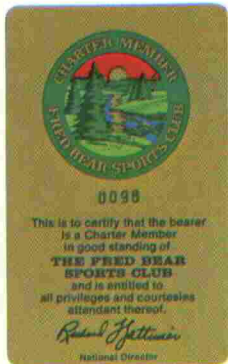

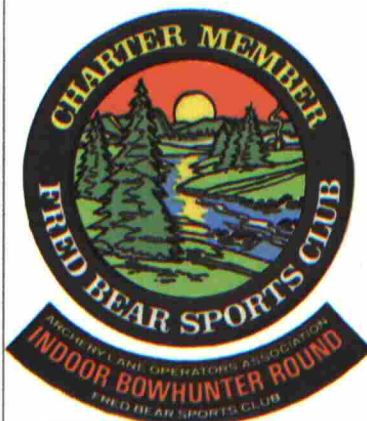
