A few notes from ICON 2015 in Indy from Joe:

- Many ideas on service projects were shared with other clubs from around the USA and world.
- Our Green Bay Downtown Club placed a copy of the newspaper article of our annual activities in a time Capsule to be opened in 100 years – in 2115. (*Editors note: Pat's picture is in the article, so he will be visually all of us 100 years from now.*)
- Toured Kiwanis Int'l World Headquarters in Indy.
- Met the new Int'l President – Sue Petrisin from the Lansing MI area. 1st woman Int' president!
- Participated in voting delegation for amendments and new bylaws – a 5 hour session.
- Eliminate Program – to eliminate Neonatal and Mother Tetanus in developing countries.
 - o Kiwanis has raised \$ 91 million of its \$ 110 million goal and has eliminated tetanus in 16 countries this far.
 - o Next 2 years hope to knock off 12 more countries of the 24 that still have tetanus problem.
 - o Our Club has sent funds to vaccinate 100 mother's and we hope to support more in the near future.
 - ***(only \$1.80 per person for vaccination regime.)

Our guest speaker was Ms. Beth A. Lemke, Executive Director of the Neville Public Museum.
