





Safety Tip Brought To You By Dick McRae

Safety Tip:

I would like to have a safety tip in each month's newsletter. So, if you come across something worth sharing with everyone else, please send it to me and I will put it in a future newsletter. This month, while at the Nats East, Ken Wakefield, the New Hampshire State Inspector showed me part of a four bar kit that was mounted on a New Hampshire street rodder's vehicle.

The street rodder had just returned from a long trip and as he pulled into his uphill driveway one of the four bar adjusters separated from the bat wing. As you can see from the pictures below, the weld did not break but the housing for the bushing did. I was told this was a polished stainless steel front four bar kit that came in a box and the street rodder just installed it on his vehicle as per the instructions stated. When I spoke with Frank Barron, the Maine State Inspector, it was his opinion the two parts were welded together at too high a temperature setting which caused the part to become brittle and eventfully fail. Therefore, when we look at four bars during our inspections, we not only need to check to make sure the safety washer is in place but we also need to check the welds on the bars to sure there is not any cracking present.


