The winner for August was 2303 Barn Swallow, belonging to Dawn and Terry Haas. The yard has a clean look with curbing separating the lovely green lawn from the flower beds in front of the house and around the golden locust tree. The flower beds contain a colorful combination of perennials and annuals, including day lilies, petunias, zinnias, marigolds, columbine, roses, and violets, with moss rock hand-picked by Terry from friends' property at Carter Lake. The front porch has hanging baskets, and elk and deer antlers add interest. The driveway is bordered by prairie grass, a large healthy aspen, and clean rock beds.
