Our History and Mission

he Richmond/Ermet AIDS Foundation (REAF) is a 501(c)(3) organization dedicated to raising funds for and awareness about AIDS service organizations in the Bay Area through the production of quality entertainment programs. In 1994, two mothers, Barbara Richmond and the late Peggy Ermet, who each lost their only son to AIDS gave birth to an idea to help raise funds for the agencies who helped care for their sons before they died.

Twenty years later, The Richmond Ermet AIDS Foundation (REAF) has distributed over \$3 million to 33 AIDS service agencies. Over that time period, REAF has also produced some of the Bay Area's biggest and best, star-studded entertainment events to raise funds for and awareness about AIDS service agencies in the San Francisco Bay Area.

Today, there are more people living with HIV/AIDS than ever before and people are still becoming infected. Thankfully, due to advances in treatment and the resources provided by local AIDS service agencies, most are able to live relatively normal, healthy lives. When REAF was founded, our primary goal was to help people with AIDS die with dignity. Today, REAF's mission is to help people with HIV/AIDS live fuller, healthier lives. We've begun to hear great news about how close we are to finding a cure for

AIDS. But that cure is not here yet and, at best, is still a few more years away before trials are completed and any treatments readily available. Over the past 20 years, REAF has provided funds to over 30 Bay Area agencies – funds which provided thousands of home delivered meals to homebound people with AIDS, ensured access to health care, provided access to legal assistance and benefits counseling, funded training for job replacements, provided thousands of HIV tests and counseling services to those at risk of or recently diagnosed with HIV and AIDS. Funds REAF has provided has done all this and so much more. Several agencies have told us they would have had to close their doors without the funds REAF provided to see them through crisis situations.

In addition to fundraising events, REAF maintains a comprehensive directory of AIDS service agencies in the Bay Area to help those seeking services to find the the resoucres they need. REAF also maintains a community calendar on our website to assist AIDS service agenices with their own planning so that agencies do not duplicate community events on the same dates.

Sponsors receive a wide range of benefits including tickets to benefit concerts for employees or clients, complimentary ads in gala programs, logo display in programs, invitations, email promotions and on our website and other benefits as detailed in the enclosed proposal. Sponsors have also seen a return on their sponsor investment dollars ranging from 200% to 300% in funds distributed to beneficiary agencies — funds that provide direct services to people living with or at risk of HIV.

Beneficiaries HELP IS ON THE WAY XX

- ★ ABZYME RESEARCH FOUNDATION. Abzyme Research Foundation exists to advance the development of abzyme technology in the hopes of producing the world's first effective HIV vaccine, and improved treatments for the over 33 million HIV-positive people worldwide.ARF will manifest this goal by: raising funds to support clinical trials, advocating funding and grants for abzyme technology, raising awareness through press efforts and public events. An HIV Vaccine is Crucial. There are an estimated 34 million HIV-infected individuals worldwide. Only 14 million of this group receive adequate anti-retroviral drugs. The complexity, expense, and side effects of anti-retroviral therapy limits its availability and effectiveness, underscoring the need for new and more effective ways to prevent and treat HIV infection.
- ★ AGUILAS. In November of 1991, a group of Gay Latinos organized to address the various needs of the Gay Latino community. The group met on a monthly basis at various homes until they found a regular meeting place at the St. Francis Lutheran Church in San Francisco, California in March 1992. They established the name AGUILAS which is an acronym for Asociación Gay Unida Impactando Latinos/Latinas A Superarse, which translates to Association of United Gays Impacting Latinos/Latinas towards Self-Empowerment. Today, AGUILAS is a non-profit organization and the largest Gay Latino organization in the San Francisco Bay Area. El Ambiente is an HIV prevention program of AGUILAS created by and for gay and bisexual Latino men. Their goal is to support their members self-empowerment in order to prevent the occurrence and relapse of unsafe sexual practices. They achieve this by providing a safe environment, specifically designed to address issues related to Latino culture, being gay and bisexual, and sexuality.
- ★ AIDS LEGAL REFERAL PANEL. The AIDS Legal Referral Panel (ALRP) is the only institution in the San Francisco Bay Area whose entire mission is dedicated to providing free and low-cost legal assistance and education on virtually any civil matter to persons living with HIV/AIDS. This includes such widely disparate areas as housing, employment, insurance, confidentiality matters, family law, credit, government benefits or public accommodations, to name just a few. This is accomplished through either direct representation of clients by one of ALRP's five attorneys or by careful placement of clients with one of ALRP's 600 panel attorneys. ALRP has handled over 45,000 legal matters for their clients over the last 23 years.
- ★ POSITIVE RESOURCE CENTER. (PRC) Since 1987, PRC has provided benefits counseling, advocacy and employment services to people affected by or at risk for HIV/AIDS. The Benefits Counseling Program maintains a 90 percent success rate in all Social Security and State Disability claims filed on behalf of clients. In 2004, Employment Services Program achieved 435 job placements including 134 long-term placements. Positive Resource Center serves 2,200 people annually.

he Richmond/Ermet AIDS Foundation creates partnerships with selected agencies to assure the success of *Help is on the Way* events. Beneficiaries team "captains" work with our Foundation committee heads, providing volunteer resources to work at the events as well mailing parties, selling raffle tickets, assisting with PR opportunities and assisting in planning and organization. 

Dear Applicant:

This modifies our letter of the above date in which we stated that you would be treated as an organization that is not a private foundation until the expiration of your advance ruling period.

Your exempt status under section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code as an organization described in section 501(c)(3) is still in effect. Based on the information you submitted, we have determined that you are not a private foundation within the meaning of section 509(a) of the Code because you are an organization of the type described in section 509(a)(1) and 170(b)(1)(A)(vi).

Grantors and contributors may rely on this determination unless the Internal Revenue Service publishes notice to the contrary. However, if you lose your section 509(a)(1) status, a grantor or contributor may not rely on this determination if he or she was in part responsible for, or was aware of, the act or failure to act, or the substantial or material change on the part of the organization that resulted in your loss of such status, or if he or she acquired knowledge that the Internal Revenue Service had given notice that you would no longer be classified as a section 509(a)(1) organization.

You are required to make your annual information return. Form 990 or Form 990-EZ, available for public inspection for three years after the later of the due date of the return or the date the return is filed. You are also required to make available for public inspection your exemption application, any supporting documents, and your exemption letter. Copies of these documents are also required to be provided to any individual upon written or in person request without charge other than reasonable fees for copying and postage. You may fulfill this requirement by placing these documents on the Internet. Penalties may be imposed for failure to comply with these requirements.
