Barber Tract and I Love a Clean San Diego

Thank you to Mike Cole and Michelle Munoz-Talcott for stepping in for Dave Talcott as site Captains on September 19. I Love a Clean San Diego's (ILACSD) engaged an estimated 7,500 volunteers at more than 100 cleanup sites at this year's Coastal Cleanup Day.

Here at WindanSea/Marine Street Beach, we had over 70 volunteers and



collected over 140 pounds of trash and recyclables.

Volunteers witnessed firsthand the negative effects of litter on the environment and took action to protect it through litter removal and beautification projects. Overall, during this three-hour event, volunteers removed more than 150,000 pounds of trash and pollutants from San Diego's

beloved beaches, bays, canyons and neighborhoods. Through this effort, volunteers also prepared San Diego's waterways to withstand the substantial rainfall that is anticipated for this fall and winter by removing trash and invasive plant material from creeks and channels.

Among the debris collected, there were several notable odd items found today, including a rusted bicycle, a full fish tank, a dragon statue and a MacBook computer.

Thanks to the hard work of thousands of volunteers, San Diegans will be able to enjoy more than 100 clean outdoors spaces.

Seagulls, Barber Tract and a Hawk

What an interesting spring and summer the northern Barbarians had with the increased seagull population that became residents at the White Sands. In the 22 years living in the Barber Tract we have seen interesting events like the Grunion run or the Langostinos on the beach, but nothing worthy of an Alfred Hitchcock movie.

This year was different. It started in the spring when the seagulls wanted to nest to ensure their species survived. They chose our roof and the White Sand's of La Jolla's roof to lay down their roots. Initially we



had two large seagulls, then four, then eight. Finally when our roof capacity reached maximum occupancy, the seagulls moved to our front patio, colonizing our patio furniture and destroying our screens to gain material for their nests. This all happened over a two week period.

Jeff and I quickly got to work deploying deterrents of all varieties, because even though seagulls only weigh 4lbs, they were pecking at our red clay tile roof to break up the tiles and make a softer nest. Incidentally they chose the areas of a roof that meat with the chimney or where

that meet with the chimney or where two peaks of the roof merge, the exact area you would not want your water proofing pecked at, as it is the area most likely to leak.

As we valiantly fought our battle on a daily basis, manning our deck with water repellent guns to shoo them away as they prepared for decent, we witnessed the population of birds on the roof of the White Sands rapidly increase. We notified the White Sands and found out that they were aware of the issue. They had spend thousands of dollars trying to seagull proof their pool without success; however, there was little they could do because seagulls are a protected species. No traps, no poison, no removal of the eggs. Nothing.



After thousands of birds colonized the White Sands and the babies were born, they hired a hawk to help with the issue, as this is a legal method of

moving seagulls to a new area. The hawk patrolled the White Sands and northern Barber Tract area for a month, and the seagulls finally got the message, time to find a new home. Neighbors beware, next spring if your roof or balcony finds itself home to a few seagulls take action immediately, or you will be spending hundreds of dollars on roof and screen repairs, not to mention the countless hours cleaning up after their less than delightful excrement.
