After the last OMTRA meeting, I went over the see the 50s race. Unfortunately, I didn't have my camera with me. Particularly, my digital camera that takes the movie clips for the Web site. It is tight racing. Every time that I see one of these the word "crusty" comes to mind, because you're in an empty warehouse. It's nighttime. You have to know where they are racing. It's not advertised in the newspaper. There are no signs. There are no promoters, in fact there is very little organization of any kind. The air is filled with smoke and other noxious gases. Grown people, on small motorcycles, are racing around barrels. It's noisy. Spectators are in the doorways and the corners. If one of the bikes goes down, spectators may have to jump out of the way to avoid having their legs taken out from under them. Racers line up against the back wall and someone walks out between the barrels, drops his hat and the race is on. The race usually ends when someone loses it. They lose traction and slide out. The bikes have had every thing taken off of the left side, foot pegs, kickstands and gear shifters. So the lean angles are impressive. Sometimes when they slide out, they will slide into another bike or two and make a big pile. Like I said, "crusty." Luckily, the speeds are pretty slow, everyone is wearing protective gear and I haven't heard of anyone getting hurt. Next time, hopefully, I will get some movie clips for the Web site.

I went over to Radical Rob's motocross track at Halfway, MO one Saturday when they were having practice. I had heard that several of the off-roaders were going to be trying to motocross. Karl Harris, Darin House, Anthony Meyer and Danny Overturf were there. Radical Rob had organized it so only one group was out there at a time, the racers, the nonracers and the kids. My off-road buddies looked pretty good in the non-racer group. Is that kind of a back-handed complement, like being the world's tallest midget? I did get some good movie clips and they are on the Web site.

LEIVAN 2 FOR 2

Although round two of the Missouri Hare Scrambles Championship was held under drastically different conditions than the opening round two weeks previous, the results played out much the same with SCR/Yamaha rider Steve Leivan overcoming an early deficit to capture the victory.

While the number-two rider in the series, Chris Thiele, jetted to an early lead, Leivan methodically worked his way up from a mid-pack start, caught the leader with one and a half laps remaining in the two hour event, and emerged with yet another win.

"This was a great race. Beautiful day, perfect conditions, and a close finish. Chris was riding really good and either of us could have won it. It all just worked out for me at the end," commented Answer, Silkolene, Scott, Dunlop, Tsubaki, NGK, Clarke, SRC, Twin Air, Sunstar, UFO, DP Brakes-sponsored Leivan.

The course, laid out by the Missouri Riders, consisted of nearly all established trails and creek beds and measured 8.4 mites in length. The top six riders completed six laps on the choppy circuit with Leivan and Thiele consistently putting together laps just under 22 minutes to average slightly over 23 mph.

Thiele again put his Kawasaki at the head of the 14 rider "AA" pack with Chad Busenbark on his YZ400, Illinois rider John.Roth, and KTM-mounted Mike Windmann in tow. Leivan emerged from turn one in seventh but was quickly up to fifth.

As is usually the case when Thiele gets in front, he started to put some distance on the field. While Busenbark maintained the second position, Roth and Windmann argued over second with Windmann taking the position briefly before going down and giving Roth back the spot.

Leivan was also able to move around the downed Windmann and then just moments later getting around Roth by virtue of an alternate line. Once into third, Leivan had a clear trail. So clear, in fact, that he assumed he was leading the race.

"Those guys (Thiele and Busenbark) checked out on us. I didn't really know where I was at the start and by the time I passed four guys, there was no dust in front of me. I kept pushing, though, trying to build a lead when I caught Chad just before the barrels and saw that my board said "third place," Leivan said.

Thiele had 45 seconds on Busenbark by lap's end who in turn had another handful on Leivan. Chris Nesbiti had his FMF, Pro Action,

Leivan chose a straighter, faster line, exiting a creek to move into second and set out after Thiele at the start of lap two. By lap's end Leivan had hammered away at Thieles' lead and shrunk it down to 32 seconds. The following lap Leivan whittled away another 11 seconds while Busenbark slipped to a minute and a half back but maintained a comfortable cushion over KTM rider Ken Yount.

As the leaders negotiated a trail that was becoming quite choppy and worked their way through lapped riders, Leivan made up 10 more ticks and could catch a glimpse of Thiele from time to time on the open portions of the trail.

"Once we hit the grass track on the fourth lap and I could see him, I knew I had a chance to catch him. My bike was working great and 1 was feeling good and I still plenty of time," explained Leivan

The pass for the lead was anticlimactic as Thiele lost the front end on a tree root and Leivan took over without even knowing it. Thiele closed back up on the grass track and retook the lead when Leivan tangled with a lapper, but just a few miles later the positions were reversed when Thiele had lapper problems of his own.

The two riders started the final lap with just a wheel length separating them and by the end of the final 22-minute dash through the timber, the gap was the same. Leivan kept his composure and maintained a torrid yet smooth pace, never opening the door for Thiele.

When all was said and done, Leivan had taken the win by three seconds on his WR400 with Thiele in second and Busenbark checking in another five minutes back in third. The podium positions were exactly the same as in round one.

Fourth fell to Yount who jumped up to the "AA" ranks after destroying the competition in the "A" class at the season opener. Nesbitt finished his ride with a solid fifth and Bobby Duncan brought his Clarke, Cycra, Wiseco, Donelson Cycles-backed YZ250 home in sixth. Roth ended his day in seventh, 30 seconds up on Jerry Hemann. Matt Pursley won the "A" class and ninth overall with Windmann rounding out the top 10.

LEIVAN LEADS YAMAHA'S BANNER DAY

The third round of the Missouri Hare Scrambles Championship saw SCR/Yamaha rider Steve Leivan exhibit his winning style once again by thoroughly dominating the MXP promoted event held at Finger Lakes State Park.

Leivan utilized the first few open comers of the motocross track to position himself in second place when the trail turned into single track, behind holeshooter Chris Thiele. Leivan patiently followed Thiele for the first few miles, and when Thiele collided with a tree, Leivan took over and pulled away from the pack until the checkered flag flew at 2:12:05.

After the event Leivan talked about his ride. "I was happy to get off to a good start and not have to come from behind again. The first lap I was just cruising, checking out the track and getting warmed up. My WR400 was working great on this slippery track and I got into a groove and just hammered out laps. This one wasn't much of a nail-biter like the other two races, but that was fine with me."

Those "other two races" Leivan referred to saw the seven time champion charge all day and pull off last lap victories.

When all was said and done this week, the Answer, Silkolene, Dunlop, Tsubaki, Scott, Clarke, NGK, UnderWARE, SRC-backed Leivan was the only rider to turn in sub-22-minute laps all day, doing so most of the event and finishing with a three

minute and 16 second cushion over second place.

Thiele, who had finished runner up in the previous two races, took some time to get going after his nasty spill and completed the opening lap two minutes behind the leaders. His day would come to a premature end, however, running out of fuel on the second lap, perhaps a result of his earlier tree collision.

Chris Caplinger and Matt Pursley on a pair of Yamaha thumpers dueled each other from flag to flag for the runner-up spot. Both riders have spent the past season racing motocross and seemed to be quite at home on the fast "motocross" type circuit. They finished the event in second and third, just eight seconds apart.

In fourth position, Chad Busenbark, on still another Yamaha four stroke, finished off of the box for the first time in 2000. Busenbark stayed in the battle for runner-up honors until fading slightly near the end and following Pursley by 30 seconds.

Cycra, Clarke, Wiseco, Donelson Cycles-sponsored Bobby Duncan rode his YZ250 to another consistent finish rounding out the top five. Duncan, in his first year as a "AA" rider, also stayed in contention for a top three finish until being forced to stop for fuel and losing touch with the group.

Riders who ran at the front early but were not contenders at the finish included KTM-mounted Ken Yount. Yount completed lap one in second position but on lap two got cross rutted in a mud hole, smacked a tree, snapped off his rear brake pedal and ended his day. Chris Nesbitt was third after a lap but chose a bad line at a mudhole and became hopelessly stuck. He lost two minutes and most of his energy in an effort to free his bike. Dropping slightly further and further back through the remainder of the event, he soldiered on to claim ninth place.

On what turned out to be a fantastic day for Yamaha riders and four stroke Yamaha pilots particularly, Rick Kinkelaar put in a stirring performance in the "A" class on his YZ426 to claim the win and place seventh overall. Kinkelaar started at the rear of the 17 rider class, had control by the midway point and took his first victory of the season.

Aaron Shaw dominated the 250 B class, being the only rider in that class to turn in six laps on his way to the win and eighth place overall , the caboose of an eight bike train of Yamahas in the overall tally.
