B. State of the Union—2019



Good afternoon my fellow Executive Board members and distinguished CTA sisters and brothers. I have had the opportunity of being your president for the past four years and today I have the privilege of delivering my fourth state of the union. Before I begin I would like to say thank you to the Executive Board and our membership as a whole, for all that you do, to make Long Beach Public Schools a great place for our children and its workers.

I would like to open by saying, I believe the state of our union has never been stronger. Even while under attack from billionaire special interest groups like the Freedom Foundation, that funded the Janus Supreme Court Case, we are stronger! Even while working with less resources and more unfunded mandates under the 2% Tax Cap, we are stronger! Even while faced with the ever-changing, state mandated APPR, we are stronger! And even while we adapt to the many district and building lead initiatives that affect how we assess, implement, deliver and assign curriculum, we are stronger! We are stronger because we band together to find common ground on how to overcome these challenges while still providing the highest level of rigor for our students.

There have been many recent district and building lead initiatives have been created with good intent. However, there are many members that would have liked to have had more input during the process. In some cases, the district has made it clear that these changes are their administrative prerogative. In other cases, these decisions are being led by a variety of district and building led committees. We have a place on district and building level committees where these decisions are being discussed. We should be, and we must be a part of these committees. It is my sincere hope that you will all consider joining one of these committees. We are stronger when our collective voice is heard during these meetings.

Last year we were faced with the Janus decision which overturned 40 years of union labor precedent. Even though expert labor analysts predicted we would lose 10%-30% of our union membership, I stand before you today proud to tell you we are at 100%. Last year we came together, educated our membership, and when the decision came out against public unions we already had all of our members sign their new membership cards. I am proud

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to say that since that time the district has hired almost three dozen new potential members and every single one of them has joined the LBCTA. We are stronger because even our newest members understand the power and importance of a unified voice.

One of the greatest challenges we face is the tax cap. As you know the Tax Cap is 2% or the CPI whichever is lower. This means the district has limited means to increase revenue while having to fund the increasing number of unfunded mandates. Luckily the district has healthy reserve funds and areas of revenue which gives them the ability to stay in the black. Although the District has been able to draw from their reserves in the past, they have made it very clear that they cannot continue this practice, and in fact have started building up their reserves.

Unfortunately, Governor Cuomo is pushing for the tax cap to become permanent as part of this year's NYS Budget. The current tax cap was ill conceived and unfairly targets schools and communities. It is unfortunate to see New York going down the same path of Proposition 13 in California. A tax policy that brought California's robust public education system from "first to worst" amongst the nation's schools. I hope you will join us in NYSUT's efforts to reform the tax cap instead of making it permanent.

Another challenge we face is the state mandated APPR. As you know the current system was forced down our throats by the State because of a Federal grant tied to the Every Student Succeeds Act. A grant, which the state diverted from our classrooms, leaving little for districts to cover its expenses. This created a system which over relies on State test scores, and that few educators value. Luckily the state has put a moratorium on using student performance measures based on the grades 3-8 ELA and Math State assessments. The NYS Senate and the Assembly passed a bill to eliminate the mandatory use of state assessments to determine a teacher or principal's effectiveness. The bill still has not been delivered to the Governor. If it is not signed, the NYS Commissioner of Education has a plan to continue the moratorium in April. If this happens we will once again be kicking the problems of the APPR down the line. Should this bill be signed by the Governor, we will once again find ourselves renegotiating our APPR. I look forward to updating you when a decision is made.

There are many challenges that we face however our strength does not come from overcoming these challenges. Our strength comes from our unity and our dedication to our students. We see this every day, as we, the practitioners, take on and implement the district's new initiatives. We see this every day when our members volunteer for afterschool and weekend programs to support our students. As an association it is important that we give back to community organizations that support our students. It is not only important that we participate in these activities but also that we come together to discuss and celebrate these acts of solidarity. It is the celebrating that allows us to unite and create positive solutions that can make a real difference in our community.

When I took on the position of President I very quickly saw the bond and camaraderie that our members share at the grade, department and building levels around the district. The bonds we share, the work we do together, and our unified voice as an organization has an amazing power and is what gives us our strength. When we come together in acts of solidarity to support important charitable causes, implement district initiatives, or to fight for equitable contract settlements—our strength, our voice and our efforts cannot be denied. I am extremely proud and honored to serve you as a collective group.

In closing, I would like to say thank you to the Executive Board and our membership as a whole for all that you do to make Long Beach Public Schools a better place for our children and its workers.

11. While we are supportive of making the HS more secure and recognize the need to move towards a single point of entry, we would like building administration to consider a compromise to allow staff to enter separate entrances in the morning.




