Monthly Report for January 2019

This is the monthly report for the Month of January 2019 from the Bloomfield Police Department. It is the police department's goal to keep the citizens of Bloomfield Township/Village informed as to the police department's activities, statistics, and community projects. It is very important that the citizens be aware of the various concerns that have and are occurring within our community.

On Tuesday, January 1st at approximately 1:04am officers checked a vehicle stopped on Pell Lake Drive under the Hwy 12 overpass. At the conclusion of the incident a 24-year-old male was arrested for operating a motor vehicle while intoxicated 1st offense.

On Friday, January 4th at approximately 10:44am officers responded to the 800 block of Primrose Road for a theft from automobile complaint. The complainant reported equipment valued at approximately \$700.00 was taken from the vehicle without the owner's consent.

On Friday, January 18th at approximately 11:25am officers responded to a personal injury crash on Hwy H at Lake Geneva Hwy. At the conclusion of the investigation a 16-year-old male driver was issued traffic citations for unreasonable/imprudent speed and vehicle tires w/less than 2/3 inch tread.

On Friday, January 18th at approximately 9:17pm officers responded to a hit & run crash on Hawthorne Rd near Rosewood Road. At the conclusion of the investigation a 20-year-old male driver was issued traffic citations for driving too fast for conditions and hit & run property adjacent to highway.

On Saturday, January 19th at approximately 1:46am officers observed a vehicle in the ditch Clover Road and Honeysuckle Road. At the conclusion of the investigation a 32-year-old male driver was arrested and confined in the Walworth County Jail. A charge of operating a motor vehicle while intoxicated 2nd offense has been forwarded to the Walworth County District Attorney's office.

On Saturday, January 19th at approximately 12:40pm officers responded to the area of Phlox Rd. and Poplar Rd. for a hit & run crash. At the conclusion of the investigation a 19-year-old male driver was issued traffic citations for hit & run, driving too fast for conditions, and operating a motor vehicle without insurance.

On Sunday, January 20th at approximately 4:56pm officers responded to a residence on Darling Road for a report of an intoxicated driver. At the conclusion of the investigation a 41-year-old male was arrested for operating a motor vehicle while intoxicated 1st offense. Additionally, the male was issues citations for open intoxicants in a motor vehicle, operating after suspension and operating a motor vehicle without insurance.

On Monday, January 21st at approximately 1:05pm officers responded to the area of Hwy B in the area of Lange Road for a welfare check driver pulled over to the shoulder of the road. At the conclusion of the investigation a 49-year-old male was arrested and confined in the Walworth County Jail. Charges of operating a motor vehicle while intoxicated 7th offense + and operating after revocation have been forwarded to the Walworth County District Attorney's office. Additionally, the driver was issued a traffic citation for operating a motor vehicle without insurance.

On Tuesday, January 22nd at approximately 10:44pm officers executed a traffic stop on Poinsettia Rd in the area of Beech Road for a snowmobile violation. At the conclusion of the investigation a 34-year-old male was issued a DNR citation for operating a snowmobile while intoxicated 1st offense.

On Sunday, January 27th at approximately 10:53pm officers responded to Spoon Doggers for a disorderly conduct complaint. At the conclusion of the investigation a 34-year-old male and a 41-year-old male were issued non-traffic citations for disorderly conduct.

On Thursday, January 31st at approximately 2:10pm officers responded to a residence on Peach Road for a fraud complaint. The complainant reported that they had received a telephone call from a male subject claiming to be employed by the Social Security Administration. The complainant reported he knew the telephone call was a scam and disconnected the telephone call but wanted to report the incident.

During the month of January 2019, the police department affected 83 arrests for various violations of Bloomfield Municipal Ordinances and Wisconsin State Statutes compared 125 arrests during the month of January 2018.
