MAYOR'S LETTER

June, as always, will be a busy month in Occoquan. Our annual spring Arts and Crafts Show will take place on June 1 & 2. As most of you are aware, the fall and spring arts and craft shows are an important component of our revenue base, serving as the primary funding source for town capital projects. Consequently, please attend if you are able, and encourage family and friends to do so as well.

On Saturday, June 8, we will also dedicate a new historical marker in honor of the late, long-time Occoquan resident Walter Bailey. The dedication ceremony will begin at 5:00 p.m. adjacent to the Mill House Museum. Then, on Saturday, June 15, Occoquan will once again be the site of the annual Duck Splash Race – now in its seventh year -- when thousands of rubber ducks will be dropped from one of the town's bridges and race to the town docks. Prizes range from \$20 to \$500, and all the net proceeds benefit the 501(c)(3) Prince William Trails and Streams Coalition. You can adopt a duck for \$5 between now and June 15 at *The Polka Dot Divas* and online at www.pwtsc.org. Last, I will be providing guided tours of town to two separate bus groups that Discover Prince William & Manassas (the county's convention and visitors bureau) has arranged to bring to town on June 3 and June 8. Please extend a warm welcome to these visitors if you see them during their stop.

June is also the month when the Town Council adopts the budget, capital plan, and tax rates for FY 2014. The hearing on the tax rates will take place at 6:30 p.m. on Tuesday, June 18, at Town Hall. Immediately thereafter that same evening the Town Council will hold a special meeting at which the rates, budget, and capital plan will be formally adopted.

Let me close by reminding everyone that Friday, June 14 is Flag Day. I'd like to encourage everyone in town to fly our nation's flag on that day. Instructions on how to do so properly were developed with our local VFW Post several years ago as part of our Flag Appreciation Campaign and may still be found on the town web site (www.occoquan.org).
