BOOK REVIEWS

One thing I have enjoyed during this time of Covid isolation is that I have been able to read much more than usual. Here are two that I have greatly enjoyed:

<u>The Spy and the Traitor</u> by Ben MacIntrye is a spy thriller that is based on actual events. Oleg Gordievsky was a Russian spy who was active during the Reagan/Thatcher era. Through his work with the British he provided information that foiled many plots, exposed Russian spies in the West, and ultimately helped to prevent nuclear escalation. The CIA worked very hard to discover his identity (which the British tenaciously concealed) unaware that Aldrich Ames, the head of U.S. counterintelligence, was secretly spying for the Russians. Gordievsky's work as a spy and his escape from Russia is a real "nail-biter" of a read.

A less intense but very interesting and enjoyable book is <u>I Have Always Loved You</u> by Robin Oliviera. Set in Paris in the late 1800s this novel centers on Mary Cassatt, an impressionist painter and her relationship with Edgar Degas as well as a number of other impressionist painters. As the name of the book implies there is a love story here, and it is very poignant and touching. Well worth reading

Woman of Troublesome Creek by Kim Michele

The book is a poignant novel based on the real life "blue people" of Kentucky and the bravery and perseverance of the Packhorse Librarians. The Packhorse Librarians were developed by the WPA program and existed between 1935 and 1943. Our main character Cussy is one of the "blue people" ostracized by most of the population; she becomes a Book Woman. This is a story of prejudice, tragedy, and grief but also of love and determination. In spite of the biases against her, Cussy manages to bring the influence of the written word to many inhabitants of Kentucky. The work of the Book Women aided the fight against the prejudice, narrow-mindedness and bigotry of the region. The book was on the bestseller list of the New York Times and USA Today, it earned a 2019 Library Reads Best Book Award, plus winning a Forbes Best Historical Novel, a Book-A-Million Best Fiction and was on Oprah's Buzziest Book pick.
