So, did your candidates win in the General Election? Find out below for unofficial results

US Senate - Kyrsten Sinema. Election was called when Martha McSally conceded on November 12th. Sinema is the first female senator from Arizona.

Governor - Doug Ducey. Election was called by end of Election Day on November 6th.

Secretary of State - Katie Hobbs as of date of this update being typed, in lead.

Attorney General - Mark Brnovich. Election was called by end of Election Day on November 6th.

Superintendent of Public Instruction - Kathy Hoffman. Election was called when Frank Riggs conceded on November 12th.

Other races too close to call, along with Secretary of State. I was advised by Secretary of State's Office to refer everyone to www.azsos.gov, then go to 2018 General Election Results for further info. Was also advised that on November 26th, all the counties in the state will have turned in their results to the Secretary of State's Office to be certified and made official. On December 3rd, the Governor will sign off on the election.

I plan to have a full listing of newly elected officials in the January bulletin.

On January 7th,2019, the state of Arizona will be having our Gubernatorial Inauguration ceremonies at the State Capitol in Phoenix. On January 14th, 2019, Governor Ducey will make his State of the State Address in the House of Representatives Chamber at the State Capitol in Phoenix. The Arizona Legislature will also begin the new session.

The flag began as a whole; therefore it is to be disposed of as a whole. Contrary to what is found on some websites, <u>The American Legion does NOT endorse the use of the flag in this manner. The American Legion Auxiliary fully supports The American Legion's position on this subject."</u>

Visually Impaired Veterans

President's Special Project

December 2018

This month I would like to tell you about my role model, my hero. My father was not a veteran. He was unable to enlist in the military because he was totally blind. That did not mean he could not play an important role during WWII and in the lives of visually impaired veterans. In 1942, my father visited the Naval Recruitment Office to inquire and to educate that visually impaired persons could do important jobs for the military. He went on to work for the Veterans Administration Blind Rehabilitation Program. His career was placing visually impaired persons into jobs.

He was convinced from an early age that electronics could be engineered to aid the blind. The picture above is from one of many newspaper clippings that I have of my dad. I say one of many because my father not only worked with blind rehabilitation, he was a ham radio operator who worked tirelessly during natural disasters, and participated in a network to match cornea donors to recipients. Being blind, he was trained to tune pianos and actually rebuilt several beautiful grand pianos. He founded the first radio station in Dodge City Kansas, KGNO, to transmit music and news.

Today, there are many more aids for the visually impaired. The cane in the article above which my dad invented was never manufactured, but the Orcam "My Eye" showcased on *Dr Phil* recently really follows the same idea. My father's dream was to supply independent travel and access to the printed word to the visually impaired. The VA, through their rehab program, is able to help visually impaired veterans achieve these goals. **I Believe** the American Legion Auxiliary **will** make a difference.

UAV Unofficial Minutes 3 November 2018

The meeting was called to order at 10:03 a.m. by Chairman Dylan Dalzotto. The opening ceremony was conducted and guest were introduced.

Stephen Clark, Executive Director of the Arizona Elk Society (not related to the Elk's Club) gave a presentation on their program. Its focus is on "healing through hunting". They take disabled veterans into a natural habitat, where they camp and hunt. This program is specifically for Arizona veterans. Their web site is azelksociety.org. Their goal is to keep veterans in the outdoors.

Mike Clemenson gave a report on the Arizona State Fair and explained the purpose and cost of the Veterans Booth at the fair. He encouraged everyone to consider volunteering for the fair next year. This is separate from the volunteers that work the fair in support of the Stand down.

Dave Lucier gave a presentation on the importance of trying to get our legislature to fund additional veteran service counselors (VSB) through the Arizona Department of Veterans Services. Currently Louisiana has 60 VSB and realizes an additional \$130 billion in revenue to the state with the benefits being brought in by the veterans. Arizona currently has 30 VSB which brings in about half a million dollars in revenue to the state. If we increase the number of VSBs our state could realize \$1 billion in increased revenue at a cost of less than \$1 million.

Sandy Simon gave a report on the Frank Luke, Jr. Memorial Museum in the West Valley. September 29th was the 100th anniversary of Frank Luke, Jr.'s death. They are trying to raise enough money to establish a permanent museum just south of Luke AFB.

Tom Sheets from the Southwest Chamber of Commerce Foundation presented the UAV a check to help fund the maintenance of the currently restored WWI Memorial at Wesley Bolin Plaza. They are located at 3820 W Happy Valley Rd, Suite #141-455. Glendale, AZ 85310.

Wanda Wright, Director of Arizona Department of Veterans Services reported that the paperwork for large grants has been open since the first of March and will be closing 31 December. Hope to be able to make the awards in February. For more information on the grants go to azdvs.gov/lggrants.

In 2019 they will be having a roadshow for "Be Connected". The Heropeneur is coming up, there will be a career fair Friday, November 16th. They are trying to make the transition from active duty to civilian life and obtaining employment as short as possible.

They are having problems keeping State Employees due to the economy.

Thanks to the "Cooties" who purchased the equipment, Liberty Hall is now a movie theater.

The nursing staff hours has changed. They work 3 days a week 12 hour shifts and then have 4 days off. This has been effect for about 10 weeks.

The ADVS has received \$1.2 million for suicide prevention.

The new Legislative Liaison is Jennifer Harris. Jennifer was an administrative assistant to a state legislator.

Luis Cardenas-Camacho from Representative Gallego's office reported on the Blue Water Bill. It was passed by the House and is not in the Senate.

Representative Gallego has requested a full report on Iraq so the legislators can review it to determine any possible health issues that need to be addressed.

Dr. Maureen McCarthy, Chief of Staff, VA Medical Facilities reported that this year is the first time that the employees have asked to participate in the Veteran's Day Parade.

They are partnering with PVA to have wheelchair races here in the Phoenix area.

The VA had a 7% increase in patient care, over 95,000 and are fourth in the nation for community care. The SAIL measures 14 metrics. They have improved in the Mental Health area. The have developed a 12 point plan to improve veteran impressions of the VA.

The VA was recognized by the American Heart Association last month for their outstanding care in cardiology. Two physicians have been recognized by the American Medical Association.

They are moving more and more to telehealth.

November they are focusing on men's health.

Terry Araman gave a report on the legislation that will be proposed at the next session of the State Legislator. There will be a steak holders meeting on November 16th, by invitation only. The next Veteran's Caucus has not been schedule yet.

I had to leave at it is now 12:15 p.m. and I have another meeting to go to. The only thing that is left is "Good of the Order".
