Perhaps we can say that this is a reminder that nature is in charge, and that our efforts in facing its fury are often futile.

One keeps hearing about how families have survived the fires and how neighbors have helped one another. Honestly, that is what is important – knowing that there are people who help and care, even at risk to their own lives.

The winds may blow, the fires burn, and you stand there with no home, clothes or possessions, yet you know that there is someone there who cares and will help and that counts for something.

IDOT Studies Highway 151

The Iowa Department of Transportation has commissioned a study of US Highway 151 from Amana to Fairfax.

The IDOT is asking for public input. If you would like to express your views, go to pima.iowadotpi. com Or go to the Iowa Department of Transportation website or Facebook page and look for the US Highway 151 Public Input Survey.

The questions range from when and how you use the highway (for business, commuter travel, personal vehicle travel, etc.) and what time of day you typically drive on the highway.

It asks questions regarding safety and if any portions of the road feel unsafe to you and why. It asks which "safety issues or concerns do you have when using this section of US 151?" And it allows you space to write specifically what you feel about Highway151, its condition, maintenance and any problems or issues you have observed. The IDOT is seeking public input right now so don't delay to fill out the survey.
