As a backdrop we are learning to live with this pandemic. We're not taking our eyes off it – it could come roaring back in deadly and virulent ways, or not. But now we know how better to deal with it, with masks, vaccines, and boosters. There may be more ups and downs, but we at CLC are ready.

As you can, please join us for worship this month. Worship is the chief work of a community of faith. Come sit and pray with us, linger, ponder, and reflect. There are Sunday mornings as well as weekday Morning Prayer. Out of that time together, by the grace of God we shall find our way about.
