Last December, City Commissioners voted to place two general obligation bonds on a ballot for a special election scheduled for March 12, 2019. The first question will ask for \$200 million to go toward park improvements The second asks for \$100 million to build a new police station in the city.

Fort Lauderdale police officers & the police chief say there are plenty of reasons they're asking for new police headquarter & this March, Fort Lauderdale voters will make that decision.

The reasons? Plenty. The elevators are ancient, the air conditioner breaks on a regular basis, the roof leaks, the offices are cramped, the basement floods & so does the parking lot. And there's plenty of evidence of past water intrusion, including carpet stains & mold

issues.

If the bond issue passes, a new police headquarters & high-security parking garage would be built in

the next few years at the existing property at 1300 W. Broward Blvd. This 85,000-square-foot building which has a basement & three floors was built in 1958 & has outgrown its 720 employees, including 520 officers.

The LRCA Board encourages all of you to vote this March 12th & to please consider voting for the Police Bond as it would give those that put their lives on the line for the greater good, our city's finest, a center of operations worthy of their sacrifice & the city they serve.

### A Message From Chief Maglione



Greetings Lake Ridge neighbors. Happy New Year and best wishes for a safe and prosperous 2019. We had a great 2018, but that does not mean we are going to rest. We endeavor to continue the downward crime trends, increase community engagement and improve the quality of life in Lake Ridge and

throughout the City of Fort Lauderdale.

I would like to start by relaying some crime statistics for 2018. The official crime rates that are published by the FBI are only out for the first six months of 2018 and we are proud to announce a 14.5% decrease. Our unofficial numbers for the entire year include a 3% decrease in violent crime, a 10% decrease in property crime and a 9% decrease in crime overall. Our arrests have also increased by 20% and our crime clearance rate has also increased by 7%.

I am also proud to announce that the homeless encampment downtown is gone and all of the folks that resided there have been placed in housing. This humanitarian effort was accomplished without a single arrest. We know we have a long way to go to address the problem of homelessness, but this was a great start. On January 9, 2019, we also held our first session of the Community Court. This court is specifically to address the special circumstances that affect our homeless neighbors, and the 'sentences' are custom tailored to each person's needs. There is also a community service component of each case so each 'defendant' will be giving back to the City.

Lastly, I would like to add a few words about a \$100 million bond issue for a new police headquarters that will be going before the voters on March 12, 2019. My intent here is to educate, not to advocate, but I would like to provide a few facts. Our current facility was constructed in 1958 when we had a population of about 80,000 residents and under 100 police officers. Sixty years later,

our population exceeds 185,000 full time residents, but we serve well over 300,000 people on an average each day. We now employ approximately 530 police officers and approximately 200 civilian community builders. We are still in that 1958 building that is currently 85,000 square feet. We also have an undersized parking lot that floods even when we receive moderate rainfall. We spend countless taxpayer dollars on repairs and leases on other properties just to keep the building operational, conduct certain training, provide necessary office space and store our property and evidence. The building is not equipped to handle modern technology that limits our ability to efficiently utilize things such as our body worn cameras and our real time crime center. Our current building cannot withstand major hurricane force winds and we actually had to completely evacuate the building when Category 5 Hurricane Irma had us in her sights.

A new facility would be constructed on the existing property with modern, energy efficient features. It would be approximately 225,000 square feet and would have a parking garage that is capable of providing the necessary protection for our vehicles. It would include adequate space for your police employees to do their jobs, areas for training and space that the public will be welcome to use for public meetings and to work together with your police department on crime prevention and safety-related initiatives. The full time resident population of the City is expected to exceed 200,000 by the year 2040, and this facility will be constructed with that growth in mind. It is also located at the main entrance to the City on Broward Boulevard and is often the first city symbol visitors see. Your police department should be a visual representation of the city you never want to leave!

### City of Fort Lauderdale to hold Special Election on March 12 for New Public Safety Complex, Parks Improvements, and Charter Changes

On Tuesday, March 12, voters will have an opportunity to participate in a Special Election to shape the future of our City. This is a non-partisan election, open only to registered voters in the City of Fort Lauderdale. To register to vote, please visit the Broward County Supervisor of Elections' website at www.browardsoe.org.

Two bond proposals will appear on the March 12 ballot. If approved, a public safety bond would allocate up to \$100 million to construct a new police headquarters while maintaining and enhancing the outstanding level of service provided by our Fort Lauderdale Police Department. A parks bond would allocate up to \$200 million for citywide improvements to our parks and recreation facilities.

The public safety bond would enable us to replace the current police headquarters, which was built in 1958 when the police department and our City were both significantly smaller. The 85,000 square-foot building is over 60 years old, functionally obsolete, and parts of it are in deteriorating condition. The new facility would offer 225,000 square feet and provide expanded work space and integrated state-of-the-art technology to a department, which has grown to 525 sworn officers and 727 sworn and non-sworn personnel.

The station would be constructed on its existing land with energy and operationally efficient features, along with hurricane resistant materials and building techniques to better serve the public safety needs of our City, which is expected to grow to over 203,000 in the next decade. The complex would also include a parking garage and additional training rooms, public meeting areas, and community space where residents and officers could work together on crime prevention and safety initiatives.

The parks bond would enable Fort Lauderdale to make significant citywide investments in our parks system to strengthen resiliency, address sea level rise, combat flooding, and mitigate the effects of climate change.

Nearly every park in our City would see upgrades and enhancements such as new playgrounds, walking trails, pools and splash pads, boat slips and ramps, outdoor fitness equipment, athletic courts and fields, lighting, solar panels and shade structures, pavilions, restrooms, ADA improvements and even new dog parks.

Funding from the parks bond would also be used for land acquisition to expand our green space and help us continue to promote active, healthy lifestyles, increase leisure and social engagement, and enhance quality of life.

A portion of the parks bond would fund signature projects in each Commission District including constructing Tunnel Top Park in District 4 atop the northern portion of the Kinney Tunnel above Federal Highway; rehabilitating Lockhart Stadium and developing the surrounding property in District 1; adding a water playground, tennis courts; sand volleyball courts, and a parking garage to Holiday Park in District 2; and building a new community center and other enhancements at Joseph C. Carter Park in District 3.

If approved, the bonds would bring more than \$300

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
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million in much-needed public safety and parks and recreation improvements to our City, strengthen our economic viability and livability, and enhance our stature as a great place to visit and an even better place to call home.

Additionally, a proposal to update our City's Charter will appear on the March 12 ballot. The Charter Amendments, if approved, would move our City's elections from March to November, beginning in 2020, to align with Presidential election years. Primary elections would be eliminated and the terms of the Mayor and Commissioners would be increased from three years to four years. These changes would bring our City in line with the majority of municipalities in Broward County.

Keep an eye out for future updates and ways that you can participate in the process. In addition, please be aware of the following important dates related to the Special Election. Voter registration for the March 12 Special Election closes on February 11. To register to vote, visit the Broward County Supervisor of Elections' website at www.browardsoe.org or call (954) 357–7050. If you prefer to vote by mail, you may request a vote-by-mail ballot from the Broward County Supervisor of Elections. The request may be made in person, by mail, by telephone, or online. The last day to request a vote-by-mail ballot is March 6. For more information, visit www.browardsoe.org or call the Broward County Supervisor of Elections Office at (954) 357-7050.




