CHCA, the longest existing civic association in the municipality, turns ninety years old this year! Coinciding with this historical benchmark is that we will begin this year with new (dare I say much younger) leadership. Tim Mizerak of Springdale Drive

will be our President. His installation occurs at the January 20th luncheon at Mt. Hope Church. Tim and his wife Rose have been leading the Litter Committee since 2022. They have been on the civic association board for three years and knows the organization well. Tim brings new ideas and skills to the job, both of which can be found in this newsletter and at the January meeting.

I am hopeful with new leadership that our younger residents will be encouraged to be part of the association by volunteering or just participating. This month is our membership drive, and the membership form lists the many opportunities to be involved in. Beginning with the park, which CHCA owns and maintains at 141 Sycamore Drive. The walking trail is a community favorite. CHCA sponsors several neighborhood events including fundraisers and parties. Volunteers maintain three bus shelters; keep litter off Lime Hollow and sections of Frankstown Roads; assemble and deliver this newsletter to 600 homes; maintain several gardens; teach yoga, hold readings in the park and welcome new residents to the neighborhood. There's a spot for you on this team!

While we are an active association, there is so much more that can occur. We have a park where people can meet and play ball, chess, corn hole, tennis or have an impromptu picnic. Someone so inclined could start a chess club and teach youngsters chess. Take advantage of this wonderful asset. Make this place your own. New ideas for using the facilities are always welcome!

In our last newsletter, we reported on the use of the stimulus grant to repair the court's flooding problem. Subsequently, with the help of Penn Hills' municipality, we have applied for a state grant to refinish the court. Since those grants are awarded in August, we shall continue to look at other grant opportunities. Any amount of time contributed is very much appreciated!

I have been President for several times starting in 1981. Before that my husband Jim and I had many roles in the association. Jim was president for three years starting in 2008. Throughout it all we were always making new friends. I feel blessed to have this organization that unites us, helps keep us safe, and informed. Jim is no longer with us, but I feel safe and supported because of all the friends I have made here. I will continue to be involved. I wish Tim great success.
