Property Taxes Due January 31, 2024

DEVELOPMENT UPDATES

Recently, we learned the 150 affordable housing units at 7205 Cameron Rd / 1500 E. St, John's Ave. (vacant lot along St. John's, behind EMS on Berkman) will be a mix of efficiency units serving seniors (55 and over) who are at or below 50% of the area median income.

Completion is set for early 2025.

The Austin Police Department encourages citizens to use <u>ireportaustin.com</u> to file a police report of non-emergency crimes – crimes that are no longer in progress and present no immediate threat to anyone.

Online reports are accepted for the following incidents:

- Assaults (minor or no injury, excluding domestic violence)
- Threats (excluding domestic violence)
- Burglary that does not involve fire/arson
- Theft (excluding prescriptions, firearms, explosives, vehicle license plates, and motor vehicles of any kind)
- Lost or missing property (some exclusions apply)
- Damaged property or Graffiti
- Counterfeiting or Forgery, identity theft
- Illegal use of a credit or debit card, fraud of any kind
- Minor, non-criminal child custody issues for documentation only
- Trespassing (suspect no longer on scene)
- Hit & Run

- Indecent Exposure
- Harassment (report hate incidents by visiting www.austintexas.gov/againsthate).

Call 9-1-1 if:

- There is immediate danger to people or property
- A crime is happening right now
- The suspect is still on the scene

NEIGHBORHOOD CENTERS PROVIDE FOOD DISTRIBUTION AND OTHER ASSISTANCE

Travis County property taxes are due in the Travis County Tax Office by **Wednesday, January 31, 2024**. The tax payments should be in their office not later than January 31, 2024. Late fees and interest of 7% will be assessed on payments received after January 31, 2024.
