Year C Acts 2:1-11 Pentecost Sunday



"When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

Pentecost Sunday Year C

Acts 2:1-11

E Pluribus Unum! Tongues? From Many Languages - One Meaning! Everyone understood the Message of God in the language they could hear! As Peter and the apostles are infused with the Spirit, their speech is understood by everyone. What a marvel! God is among all the Peoples again. God gathers them in, through His Spirit. He is bringing the many, scattered peoples of the earth back together into one again! We see a 'Re-verse' of the OT Babel event, that draws in people to God, instead of scattering them! Acts 2:4 says they "began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim" and Acts 2:6 says that "each person heard them speaking in his own language." What a remarkable, universal language of the Holy Spirit that touches everyone's heart and re-unites the human family again. As this miracle of unification occurs, God could certainly day to all of us, "Now you are speaking my language!" God's language is one of unity and harmony, of bonding and peace. Again, what a powerful experience of God's presence among His People as ONE! Jesus' prayer at the Last Supper was that He would be known and seen by the world among His Disciples, through their unity and love. Just before His commissioning of them to lives of loving service in His Name (washing their feet), He announced, "This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:35). Later in the meal He specifically prayed for their unity (that they be ONE) and declared that their unity would be the persuasive sign of God among them. In John 17 which records Jesus' prayer to the Father, Jesus says that the unity example of His disciples is what convinces or persuades others, "that the world may believe that you sent me" (17:21). Jesus repeats in verse 17:23 "that the world may know that you sent me." Truly being united together with one another is a mark of God's presence!

And what about those names? "Parthians, Medes, and Elamites....." Pronouncing all of the country nations, itself, sounds like speaking in tongues! Luke seems intentionally symbolic about the nations, their placement in his list and their numbering. First, their numbering: there are 16 nation areas mentioned, and 17 if we count, starting with the Galileans-the Apostles themselves. Now, I do want to add, mentioning here that sometimes (How many I'm not sure?? Is that like the joke that 62% of statistics are wrong?), but sometimes, yes, we can get carried away with numerology (symbolic use of numbers). So if I may sum-marize first, the number 17 and the order of the specific nations by their direction, is meant to indicate the universal call (for everyone everywhere) of the Gospel, and the spreading of the Kingdom of God, from the East out to all the World! but to show the work of this math, if we see the factors of addition, 10 and 7, and multiply them, we'd get 70, which happens to be the number of countries mentioned back in Genesis chapter 10 lists the Table of Nations (from descendants of Noah). 70 is also the number of elders-leaders that Moses called together and God sent the holy Spirit upon so that they could lead God's people in Number 11:24-25. Yet also realizing that when Jesus called the 'fishermen' apostles, Jesus gave them a new vocation to 'fish for men'. Ezekiel 47:9-10 speaks about God's kingdom as a 'netting in of many, many kinds of fish-as many as are known', from En-Gedi & En-Eglaim'. En-Gedi and En-Eglaim were the North/South edges of Dead Sea, which Ezekiel prophesied that God would make 'living' again by entering it). It mathematically happens that the Hebrew letters for these location directions add up to E n Gedi = 17, and En Eglaim = 153. We hear about the 17 nations of the world here according to Luke. Of course, the 153, sounds familiar because John 21:11 told of Peter dragging the net to bank, at the miraculous catch of fish on the seashore after Jesus' resurrection (153 known ethnicities at the time)! Again, there is a temptation to go *overboard* with numbers, but the divisible factors of the number of gathered disciples on Pentecost (120 according to Acts 1:15) in the upper room, amounts to 16 variables—the number of named geographic locations in Acts. But I think we get the message. God intends the gospel to be shared and spread everywhere in the world (everyone is included)! And if we imagine the flame of the Holy Spirit, the breath language of God sweeping over the earth, to begin in the area of the Elamites, Parthians and Medes, that is the East, and the continuing named nations spread out north, west, south and back toward Jerusalem East to complete a circle (like radar scope's rotation). The Gospel Fully Circling the known World!


