

College Writing Skills

My college prep class will allow students to prepare for the SAT/ACT tests (critical reading and writing sections) as well as to learn effective writing techniques for the essay sections for college admission and scholarship applications. During September and the first half of October, class assignments will revolve around learning strategies for taking the SAT/ACT tests and practicing those strategies by taking timed sections of those tests as homework assignments. Vocabulary work will begin immediately with the first class, and tests will be given on a weekly basis. Essay questions will be assigned which are similar to those given on the actual tests. Grammar lessons will be incorporated as needed in teaching for SAT prep and for writing at the college level. During the fall semester, students will prepare essays for college admissions' officers as well as for scholarship applications.

A crucial part in the writing process is the understanding of the various types of sentences and sentence openers, the "shapes" of paragraphs, and the structure of the essay itself, which is the foundation of all college writing. Students will also be exposed to various ways to plan, or pre-write essays, thus making the process more efficient and less threatening. Essays are shared in class during our read-aloud session each Friday, and these readings are much anticipated as we all become better acquainted with one another through regular sharing. A binder is required to help students keep their work organized. The information is on my website. All assignments and handouts will appear on my website on a weekly basis, so there is no excuse for missing assignments due to absences.

My class tuition is **\$70 per month per student** if paying monthly. There is a nice discount if you pay for the first semester at registration and the entire second semester in January. A discount also applies if you pay for the whole year in August. See the chart below for the discounted amounts. If you decide to remove your student(s) before the end of the semester, tuition for the entire semester is still required.

I will order the books for you and will use and distribute **additional copies of supplementary material throughout the year as needed. The class book use/supply fee is \$120 per student** to cover the writing, grammar, and vocabulary materials to be distributed/used throughout the year. This year, the books will consist of a classroom set that the students will use during the year and return at the end of May. **The book/supply fee of \$120 is not refundable once you register.**
