“JUDGMENT AND HOPE”

‘Here I Am, Send Me’

Romans 10:15 The gospel of peace that bring glad tidings of good things.

“Then I heard the Lord asking, “Whom should I send as a messenger to this people? Who will go for us?” “I said, “Here I am. Send me.” Isaiah 6:8.

Christian character qualifications:

Faith, **willingness**, boldness, yearning, humility, tenacity, and love.

Willingness. We must have the willingness of Isaiah. *When God calls and looks for someone to go and speak to other people, we need to say that we are here willing to be used and sent by Him.*

Isaiah worked to reform social and political wrongs.

Political correctness is often an attempt to justify sin by giving it a more acceptable name than what the Bible calls it.

Isaiah’s writings expressed a deep awareness of God’s *majesty and holiness*.

Some strengths and accomplishments of Isaiah:

- He had powerful messages of both judgment and hope.
- He carried out a consistent ministry even though there was little positive response from his listeners.

Lessons from Isaiah’s life:

- God’ help is needed in order to comfort people while effectively confronting sin.
- One result of experiencing forgiveness is the desire to share that forgiveness with others.
- God is purely and perfectly holy, just, and loving.

“Let not mercy and truth forsake thee; bind them about thy neck; write them upon the table of thine heart; So shalt thou find favor and good understanding in the sight of God and man.” Proverbs 3:3-4.
