Clubhouse Committee Meeting Minutes March 06, 2025

Clubhouse meeting called to order by Laura Gola. Financial report given by B. Kibler. Our expenses for February totaled \$1,319.70. Income for this same period was \$680.00.

The fundraiser for March has been Texas Roadhouse, Brighton, March 17. If you have any ideas as to where we can go for future fundraisers, please let the Board know. These greatly help our bottom line. The 50/50 also held at events also helps.

Bathroom renovations discussed. Only one contractor has gotten back to us so far. It was discussed splitting the project into different phases. Example framing mirrors rather than replacing. Framing the defective part is less expensive than replacing it. This would also update them. Painting the room was also discussed. Tabled for future discussion. Where there's Geese, There's ... *by Denise Semion*

Back in 2015, the Board of Colonial Acres Phase V, with assistance from Clearview Management, began participating in the Canada goose nest destruction program coordinated by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and Michigan Department of Natural Resources (MDNR). The nest destruction program gives Phase V a permit to destroy Canada goose eggs.

Since that time, authorized individuals conduct nest destruction activities each spring according to the requirements of the permit. Since that time, more than 100 eggs have been removed from nests and destroyed.

Nest destruction activities will take place again this year. Locations of the nests are generally known, as they tend to nest in the same places every year, but if you think the geese have made a new location to nest, we need to know. Last year only two nests were found.

You might wonder why do we still have an abundant goose population? Some of the geese you see in the summer may have nested nearby (such as the neighboring wetlands and apartment complex on Pontiac Trail) and come to our ponds. Additionally, the program was suspended for a few seasons during the pandemic.

Please do not approach the geese, or the nests. And please do not feed the geese or other wildlife by throwing seeds, crackers or popcorn on the ground. Feeding geese encourages other wildlife, like sandhill cranes, to become dependent on humans for food. We've had many incidents of cranes destroying door wall screens because of this in the past.

TEX-MEX SPAGHETTI FOR 2

2 2/3 OZ. ground beef
1/3 cup chopped onion
¼ cup chopped green bell pepper
1 t garlic powder
5 oz. tomato sauce
5 oz. can diced tomatoes with liquid
½ t chili powder, and ½ t cumin
3 oz. spaghetti pasta
3 T. shredded cheddar cheese

Cook beef, bell pepper, onion, and garlic till browned.
